## HBPres Centennial Campaign

For nearly 100 years Harvey Browne Memorial Presbyterian Church has ministered to St. Matthews and the surrounding community, spreading God's word and sharing God's love. The crowning achievement of our Centennial Celebration in 2016 will be a magnificent Centennial Cross surrounded by a beautiful Memorial Garden. Together they will represent a century of ministry and mission.

The 20-foot cross, designed by artist Guy Tedesco, will be modeled after the beautiful cross he created for our

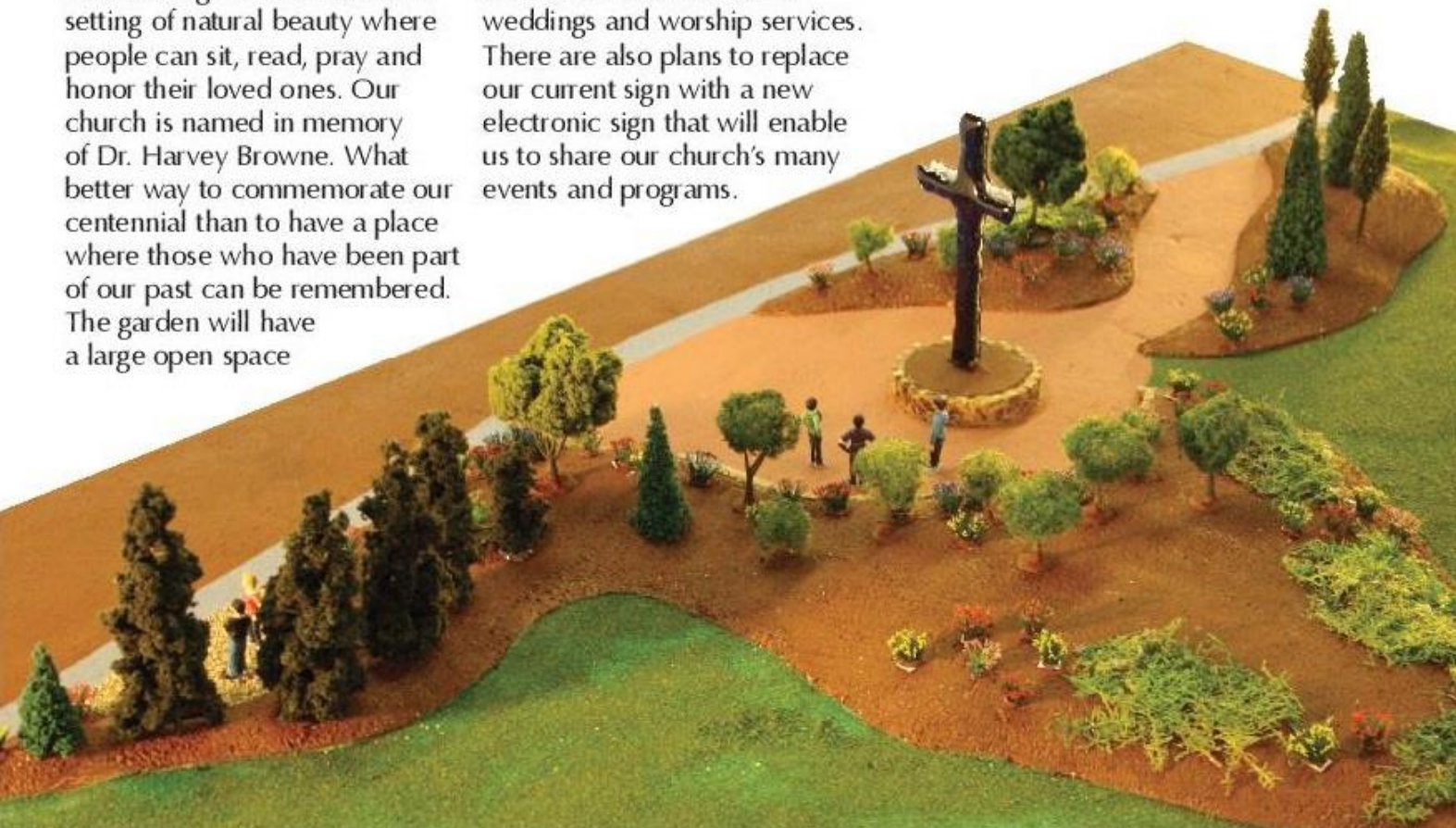
Sanctuary. It will consist of dozens of individual colored crosses of various sizes, each made of solid glass and attached to a bronze structure designed to withstand nature's elements. As with our interior cross, the design will reflect the fact that we are individuals who together form a community of faith. As in creating the Sanctuary cross, church members will help to create the new exterior structure.

The cross will be a work of art and a testament to our faith in Jesus Christ, who has guided our church for the past 100 years.

Surrounding the cross will be a setting of natural beauty where people can sit, read, pray and honor their loved ones. Our church is named in memory of Dr. Harvey Browne. What better way to commemorate our centennial than to have a place where those who have been part of our past can be remembered. The garden will have a large open space

suitable for events such as weddings and worship services. There are also plans to replace our current sign with a new electronic sign that will enable us to share our church's many events and programs.

The Centennial Cross and garden are part of a capital funds campaign that also includes two necessary maintenance projects – a new roof and extensive repairs to the elevator outside Emory Hall – replenishing money borrowed from the Facilities Reserve Fund to balance the 2015 budget, a three-year outreach component to benefit Habitat for Humanity and funds for our Centennial Celebration in 2015-2016. Our Centennial Celebration will begin in September of 2015 and conclude shortly after our anniversary date of August 13, 2016—100 years from the day our church was originally chartered. Our celebration theme is Sharing God's Love, Generation to Generation. The capital campaign will likewise begin in September and conclude on December 31, 2016. You and many others who have helped to write our church's glorious history are the key to making this campaign a successful celebration of our first century of ministry and mission. Your support will enable us to continue sharing God's love for our next hundred years.



## About the Artist

Creating the opportunity for people to interact with art in a way that opens their minds and hearts—for a moment, an hour or forever—is

one way Guy Tedesco views the mission of his work. A Louisville native living in Southern Indiana, Guy has worked in a wide spectrum of media to give appropriate form to projects that can be seen around the world. A few of his local works include a bronze statue of Thomas Jefferson in Warder Park in Jeffersonville, Indiana; a bronze statue of St. Francis of Assisi at Mount St. Francis in Floyds Knobs; a portal, interior sign and chancel cross, crafted from glass and copper, in the chapel at Norton Healthcare Pavilion in downtown Louisville and our own beautiful Sanctuary cross, baptismal fountain and communion table.

## Centennial Campaign Details

The centerpiece of the Centennial Campaign will be a 20-foot Centennial Cross, a memorial garden and a new informational sign.

The campaign will also raise money for:

- A new roof
- Repairs to the elevator outside Emory Hall
- Replenishing money borrowed from the Facilities Reserve Fund
- A three-year outreach contribution to Habitat for Humanity
- The 2015-16 Centennial Celebration
