I imagine you have been getting up early each morning and pouring over your Lenten Bible readings. Perhaps you even had some carry-over credits from the Christmas season because you went to both the 5 and 11 o’clock Christmas Eve services. ### Stephen Ministers – Listening, a way of Life

There is a lesson in the Stephen Minister training called “The Art of Listening.” Listening has been defined as “Following the thoughts and feelings of another and understanding what the other is saying and meaning from his or her point of reference.”

There is an exercise in training class called SOLAR. It gives a way to show another you are hearing what they are saying. Sit slightly forward, maintain an Open relaxed posture, Look into the eyes of the other person, pay strict Attention to what they are saying so you can Reflect back what was said.  
From Stephen Ministry Training Manual

Really listening can make a difference in many areas of our lives. After attending the listening session, one Stephen Minister gives this testimony: “I came home and for the first time I really concentrated on listening to what my spouse was saying. It has made a difference in our relationship.”

Someone has written:  
When I need you to listen and you start giving me advice, you have not done what I need. When I need you to listen to me and you feel you have to do something to solve my problem, you have failed me. All I ask is that you listen, not talk or do- just hear me. When you accept as a simple fact that I feel the way I do, the answers began to become more obvious to me.

Have you recently listened, really listened to another? Has someone really listened to you? Listening can make a difference in our lives.

## Grocery Cart

The recipient of Grocery Cart donations for April 2014 is **House of Ruth**, a nonprofit organization founded in 1992. It was incorporated to meet the local service needs of women and children infected or affected by HIV/AIDS. The service population has since expanded to include men living with HIV/AIDS, and the lives of more than 1,100 people, including nearly 300 children, and 700 households each year. House of Ruth offers housing and support services with a holistic focus on individuals who are HIV-positive, as well as their family members who count on them for financial and emotional support. Client Services include: Housing Programs, Case Management, Children's Programs, Financial Assistance, Social Gatherings/Holiday Events, Monthly Adult Life skills, Workshops, and Advocacy & Education.

## Building the HB – Habitat Connection

Twenty houses down, many more still to come. HBPres has been a part of building 20 homes with Habitat for Humanity, providing 20 families with affordable housing in Metro Louisville. It has provided countless HBPres volunteers with the opportunity to share their construction (or culinary) talents.

Most of these homes have been done in partnership with other Presbyterian churches to answer that age-old question, "How much wood would a Presbyterian paint if a Presbyterian would paint wood?" Harvey Browne's physical and fiscal support joins with the 400 hours of sweat equity put in by the partner family.

Our congregation has always been generous with the Habitat Special Offering. We have made sure that the amount from HBPres has not declined over the years. This year, we hope to grow the amount.

In 2014, Habitat will build 25 homes in the Metro area. On March 16, Habitat was featured in our Minute for Mission by Brian Pollock, an HBPres member who is a longtime volunteer with Habitat. 



## Group Study - *Engage*


Do you teach Sunday school? Volunteer with jubilee? Attend the 10am service? Would you like the opportunity to participate in a group study?

### Easter Bread Time Is Here

On Easter Sunday, April 20 from 9:20-11:00 a.m., Emory Hall will be transformed with flowers, banners, and tables full of breads of every kind, from your family favorite coffee cake or cinnamon rolls to traditional Easter breads from many areas of Europe. Come and enjoy the celebration.

The breads need to be brought to the downstairs kitchen Saturday April 19th, between noon and 2:00 p.m. Labeling and cutting the breads and decorating will begin at 2:00 p.m. Be sure to identify your bread with your name and the kind of bread and mark your name on any returnable platter or pan.

All sweet breads are welcome. We also remember the Easter Duck, Easter Cross, ring with colored eggs tucked inside and the pretzels and Hot Cross Buns. Special traditional Easter breads add to the celebration. This year we are resurrecting an old tradition of labeling any special breads with the name and country of origin, and leaving them together rather than including them in the trays of assorted breads. Consider making traditional breads this year. Both *HBPres* cookbooks have Easter bread recipes - *Hot Browne* on pages 28-35 and *Hot Browne, A Second Helping* on pages 162-174 with pretzels on page 182. Goggle "Easter breads" and find lots more.

Come to Emory Hall on Easter morning and celebrate our Risen Lord with feasting and fellowship. Alleluia

### April Bookanalia

Bookanalia for Wednesday, April 23 will be a sharing of the books of Kentucky's Poet Laureate, Frank X. Walker. The stories he tells about people from history, Buffalo Dance, The Journey of York, When Winter Come: The Ascension of York, Issac Murphy: I Dedicate this Ride, and Turn Me Loose: The Unghosting of Medgar Evers all read like small, very short historical novels told through verse. They bring to life and give voice to these sometimes neglected people and their relatives, friends, and even foes in ways that will stay with you a long time.

In Affrilachia and Black Box Poems, Walker shares his own experiences as an African American growing up and living in Eastern Kentucky. The verses express a full range of experiences and emotions, funny, warm, sad, angry, hopeful and everything in between.

Mr. Walker is a professor at University of Kentucky, the founding member of the Affrilachian Poets and a Cave Canem Fellow. He received the 2005 Lannan Literary Fellowship for Poetry. In 2004 he won the Lillian Smith Book Award for Buffalo Dance. He edited a collection, America: The "Other" Poets Unfurl the Flag, and is the editor of Pluck! The Journal of Affrilachian Arts and Culture. Walker is generous in opening opportunities for other young Black poets. We have been truly fortunate to meet this engaging author as he has appeared several times in Jefferson County this fall and is traveling around the state as the Poet Laureate.

The Louisville Public Library has only one or two copies of each of his books other than Issac Murphy. Carmichael's has agreed to have all of his books available for us and will give a 20% discount if you mention Harvey Browne Bookanalia. As you read his books, pick your favorite poems to share, or if you do not have a chance to read his poems, come and listen and get to know about this amazing writer.


