Dear Friends,

Wilting as we are in the late summer heat, it's hard to believe that school starts in a couple of weeks. The freedom from routine will soon be over. (I have a teacher friend who says that when school lets out in June, it's like you have all the time in the world, and then...it's over!)

The resumption of school provides an opportunity for us to remember the importance of education, and especially public education, in our society. Presbyterians have always been at the forefront of those who have advocated education for all. Writing nearly 500 years ago, the dour Presbyterian Scot John Knox said: "For as youth must succeed to us, we ought to be careful that they have knowledge and erudition." Scotland was among the first countries in the world to provide education for all boys and girls.

Thirty-two years ago, the 199th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church issued a powerful statement entitled "A Call to Church Involvement in the Renewal of Public Education." The words of that report are worth quoting today:

"Participating in strengthening public education is both a moral obligation and a continuing responsibility for every Christian.

"All persons must be free to search for the truth wherever it may be.

"The Reformed Tradition (of which we Presbyterians are a part) seeks to support all efforts toward the removal of ignorance and bigotry.

"The Reformed Tradition holds that privatism, which seeks exemption from the conditions prevailing in a society, is incompatible with God's intention for our lives."

So as school resumes, I urge you to pray for those who go back to class. Pray for administrators who face difficult challenges. Pray for teachers in the classroom, who have the most important jobs in our society. And above all, pray for the students, that they may be free and safe to question and explore and learn.

That kind of praying is something we Presbyterians have done for a long time.

July 28: Michael Parker







WELLNESS BRIEF DO YOU HAVE AN EMERGENCY?

When do you call 911?

Can you drive yourself?

In a true emergency, driving yourself or having someone else drive you is very risky and uncertain, especially if your condition becomes more serious while traveling to the nearest health facility. A dull abdominal pain can become an urgent health emergency. In this case an ambulance is the fastest and safest route to an ER.

An Ambulance and EMT’s are equipped to handle an escalating emergency and the hospital will now about your condition to continue care. Other reasons an ambulance should be called include breathing problems, chest pain or bleeding that can’t be stopped.

Should it be an ER or Urgent Care?

An ER is staffed with physicians and is open 24/7. They’re equipped to stabilize and treat a patient. Urgent care facilities are a more convenient option for treating less serious illnesses and injuries such as the flu, a fever, nausea, sprains or cuts.
