## HB Pres University Winter Term Adult Sunday School February 4—March 25 9:45-10:45 a.m.



## Wellness Brief

Did you know this about the brain?

- Learning a new skill creates new pathways for communication within the brain.
- To protect your brain be active, guard your health, sleep, and socialize with family and friends regularly.
- An infection in the ear, being so close to the brain, can cause Meningitis.
- Dancing is good for the brain. When 26 older adults took dance lessons or did endurance and flexibility exercises at least once a week for 18 months in a recent study, their brains' hippocampus increased in size. That's good news as the hippocampus plays a key role in learning and memory.
- Feeling low? Get more light where you are. Natural light is restorative and stress reducing and helps the brain release hormones such as sleep inducing melatonin. We need 7-9 hours of sleep per night.


In March it will be *A Gentleman in Moscow* by Amor Towles. Visitors are welcome. For information contact Sarah Grant.






