SESSION APPROVES ACTION TO BECOME A "MATTHEW 25 CONGREGATION"

The Presbyterian Church (USA) is encouraging its congregations across the country to become "Matthew 25 congregations", inviting us to actively engage the world around us. Matthew 25 congregations commit especially to three initiatives:



- **BUILDING CONGREGATIONAL VITALITY** by encouraging members to deepen and energize their faith, and to grow as disciples actively engaged in their communities in sharing the gospel in word and deed
- **DISMANTLING STRUCTURAL RACISM** by using our faith to break down systems and ways of thinking that underlie discrimination, prejudice, and oppression of people of color
- **ERADICATING SYSTEMIC POVERTY** by working to change laws, policies, and structures in our society that exploit people who are poor





Jonathan Yi, a native of Richmond, VA, is a Performer Diploma student under the tutelage of Alexander Kerr at the Jacobs School of Music. He is an active performer at the Jacobs School of Music, Indiana University and has made appearances in chamber concerts and has served multiple leadership positions in the orchestras during his stay. He was awarded second prize at the Mondavi National Young Artists Competition as well as the award for the commissioned work. In 2014, he made his debut with the Louisville Orchestra as winner of the Louisville Orchestra Young Artist Competition. He has attended the New York String Orchestra Seminar, the Music Academy of the West and the Aspen Music Festival as a fellowship recipient. Jonathan and his family are member of the Korean Presbyterian Church of Louisville.

Sohyun Park draws upon her deep love for the piano and chamber music to offer a musical experience for audiences worldwide. Currently, Park is pursuing her Master of Music in Collaborative Piano at Indiana University Jacobs School of Music where she is a Graduate Assistant under Anne Epperson and Kevin Murphy. Additionally, she is maintaining an active schedule in both chamber music and collaborative piano repertoire. Most recently, she performed two concerts in Cambodia with the Presbyterian Theological Institute in Phnom Penh, and at the Ewha Srang School in Kampong Speu. In her home country of Korea, she worked for the Seoul National University double bass studio as the collaborative pianist. During that time, she also served as an accompanist with the Seoul Baroque Chamber Orchestra Summer Festival for three years. In 2019, Park and internship with the Castleman Quartet Program at SUNY Fredonia in Upstate, NY where she had the honor of collaborating with Charles Castleman.

In addition to her work as a performer of traditional works, Park has had the privilege of performing new works by the Russian composer Sophia Gubaidulina at the Seoul International Music Festival, as well as Eric Ewazen and Ellen Taaffe Zwilich at the new music festival in Lynn University.





HBPres - MISSION & OUTREACH

HYGIENE KITS

Mid-Kentucky Presbytery is aiding the PC(USA) Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) program by assembling hygiene kits for use in disaster relief efforts. This event coincides with Louisville, Kentucky mayor Greg Fischer's annual Give a Day Week of Service initiative.




