Are You A Fundamentalist?

We have just completed one of the most intense and exciting seasons of the year. March Madness is now in the past! Often you will hear coaches of the losing team state that their team got away from the fundamentals. Why would that be important when you have super star “one and dones” who seem to transcend the basics? Because, no matter how good you think you are, the fundamentals are what got you there and what will sustain you in the long haul.

We have just completed one of the most intense and exciting seasons of the year. Holy Week and Easter! During this time we too have been reminded of the fundamentals – the basics of our faith. On Thursday we literally gathered around the table and remembered how important it is for us, as a community of faith, to share this meal together. We again were reminded that it is all about love. Maundy (from the Latin *Mandatum*) means mandate. Jesus gives us a new mandate. We are to love one another. In other words, share the ball. You aren’t the star. It’s about others.

On Friday we are reminded of the importance of sacrifice. God becomes incarnate and suffers in human flesh so that we may know the depth of God’s love for us. It’s a gruesome story. The details make us uncomfortable as we squirm in our own flesh imagining the pain and suffering of God’s own flesh. If we didn’t know the end of the story we would leave the darkened building without hope and in total despair. That’s how the disciples felt.

On Sunday we gathered to celebrate hope. We do know the end of the story and it turns out rather well. Darkness cannot overcome light. Love is stronger than evil. Let the Hallelujahs ring!

These three days – Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Day are the fundamentals of our faith and we need this yearly reminder to keep us on track for another twelve months. Some have hijacked the term “Fundamentals” and turned into a strict code of conduct with rigid rules and regulations. They are known as Fundamentalist and often this is not a term of endearment. However, those who came on Thursday, Friday and Sunday are the true “Fundamentalists.” To share a meal together, to know that it is about love, especially love for neighbor, stranger, alien, and immigrant. To be reminded that this kind of love leads to sacrifice, yea even death. And to celebrate that death is not the end. There is hope!

If these are the fundamentals, then please count me in as a Fundamentalist!

NEW OFFICE SECURITY AT HARVEY BROWNE

The Support Committee has been discussing building security for some time, and the conversation always steps up when a national news story covers yet another act of violence visited on a house of worship. While we continue to explore our options, the first step we took was to secure the office. If you visit in the daytime, you know that the only outside entrance that is unlocked is the one in the back parking lot. You also know that the double doors are secured when the preschool is in session. Up to now, our office door has not been secured, leaving the office staff vulnerable.

The office door now has a magnetic lock, and it must be released from the inside by either Samantha or Cheryl. To get their attention, a keypad is just to the right of the door, and a button with a bell on it signals that you are awaiting entry. The keypad is equipped with a video camera and an intercom. If no office staff is available, you can ring the call bell for the maintenance staff, just to the left of the door. We hope that this doesn't inconvenience our members too much. Security is always a priority.

*When there is activity in the building after office hours,
such as Wednesday nights and Sundays, the office will be unlocked.*

Session has approved a new covenant with the Korean Presbyterian Church of Louisville that formally makes the chapel area their permanent church home. While they have been worshiping in the chapel for a number of years, this step increases the footprint and the responsibilities for their congregation. A team coordinated by Paul Huh, including Bill Williamson and Maggie Chilton, Pastor Jae Sin Han, Pastor YoHan Kim, and Elder Harry Yang, has worked for several months to arrive at this new relationship. In addition to the chapel and an office, the Korean church will occupy rooms C27 (formerly the Stephen Ministry room), C28 (formerly the Barret room), as well as C21, C22, C23 and C26, and they are responsible for the cleaning and routine maintenance. If you venture over there you will see some wonderful changes taking place. They agreed to a contribution to Harvey Browne that covers the pro-rated utilities and other plant-related expenses.

The Presbytery is as excited as we are, and the covenant will be recognized at the May 20 Presbytery meeting, which will be hosted by our Korean housemates. This covenant may become a model for how churches share facilities.

Obviously, some adjustments were necessary for Harvey Browne. We had to relocate the Stephen Ministry materials (to room 209) and the middle school Sunday School class will be in a different room in the fall. We also had to give up a lot of storage space, causing a huge closet re-distribution, almost completed.

The KPCL will continue to use Eline Hall for their Sunday lunch. They also welcome our use of their designated space. Requests should be directed to Pastor YoHan, who can be reached at: yohaneykim@yahoo.com.

BREAD FOR THE WORLD

Bread for the World's 2019 Offering of Letters: “ Better Nutrition, Better Tomorrow” focuses on global child nutrition programs. Although hunger and poverty have been reduced by nearly one half in the past 30 years, there are still 821 million people, that suffer from extreme hunger (about 11% of the world's population). While progress has been made in countries such as Ghana and Honduras where stunting has been cut by one third, one in four children worldwide suffers from malnutrition which results in stunting, a condition that cannot be reversed and results in lifelong damage to a child's physical and mental development.

Bread for the World is asking that \$250M be allocated for global nutrition, \$20M more than last year. Nutrition is understood to mean fighting hunger, but it also underscores the need for food that is nourishing and not only filling. Clean water, access to vitamins and minerals, and sanitation are also factors that influence the effectiveness of nutrition programs.

On May 19 & 26 there will be the opportunity to be part of the solution to the problem by writing or signing a letter to our members in Congress and urging them to vote in favor of the funding for global nutrition. Hand-written letters are always the most effective, so please consider the possibility of sending your own message, even if it is brief!

LETTER FROM THE CONGO

Dear friends of the Congo Mission Network,

From the early days of Presbyterian World Mission, Presbyterian Women (PW) have been champions of our denomination's international endeavors. Until this day, women in PC(USA) congregations across the country continue supporting projects worldwide through the annual Thank- and Birthday Offerings, many of them proposed by global partners of the Presbyterian World Mission.

I'm thrilled to be able to let you know that this year, the PW Creative Ministries Committee awarded a \$20,000 grant to the Christian Medical Institute of the Kasai (IMCK) for a bore-hole installation at the PAX Clinic and Women's Center in Kananga. This grant will allow IMCK to reduce the shortage of drinking water at the PAX Women's Center, to prevent water borne diseases, to better ensure hospital hygiene, and to save on the costs of buying water. The project will foremost serve those seeking medical services at the PAX polyclinic, i.e. pregnant women coming in for prenatal consultations or to give birth, and their newborns but the general population in the area will also benefit.
