Dear Friends,

Elsewhere in this newsletter you will see that the Session of Harvey Browne has asked me to serve as interim Head of Staff in these days following John Roper's retirement as our pastor. I am humbled by this request, and am glad to serve in this capacity as best I can.

This service will only take place until a Transitional Pastor is named, so I suppose that makes me a sort of interim interim pastor. The Transitional Pastor should be in place by the first of June or shortly thereafter, and will serve until a new permanent pastor is installed.

In a way, even the designation of "permanent" pastor is a misnomer. As John Roper's departure has sharply reminded us, no pastor is permanent, not even one who has served as John did for over two decades. Every time a pastor is called, there is in the back of our minds the realization that the time will come when that time of service will come to an end. Every pastor is a transitional pastor.

If we seek the continuity in a church, it is to be found, not in the pastor, but in the church members. Ministers come and ministers go, but the identity of a church is in those who are a part of that community of faith. Do you seek the community of Harvey Browne? Look around the next time we gather for worship. YOU are the church—you by your service, your participation, your support of one another, your prayers, your witness, your devotion to the faith.

And finally it must be said that in the end even the service of church members is transitional. One of the prayers in our Book of Common Worship begins: "O Lord, before you the generations rise and pass away." We who are a part of the church stand on the shoulders of giants, those who have gone before us in their own witness and service.

The church is but a way station on the way to glory. As the book of Hebrews puts it: "Here we have no lasting city. We seek the City which is to come." (13:14) In this interim time, let's join together in witnessing to the faith which we share in Jesus Christ our Lord.


Thank you



Bill Williamson Named Acting Head of Staff

The Session has approved our parish associate, Bill Williamson, to serve as acting head of staff until a transitional pastor is in place. Bill will assume this role effective May 1, following the departure of John Roper, who retired as pastor at the end of April after more than 21 years at **HBPres**.

A Transitional Pastor Nominating Committee (TPNC) is in the process of searching for someone to serve as the transitional pastor until the next pastor is called. The search for the next pastor is expected to take more than a year. The TPNC has conducted preliminary phone interviews with several candidates and is preparing for face-to-face interviews with the top candidates.

The committee hopes to recommend a final candidate to the session later this month. That person will then have to be approved by the Commission on Ministry of Mid-Kentucky Presbytery.

Please continue to pray for the TPNC as it completes its assignment and for Bill as he assumes his new responsibilities.




Bookanalia


2018 Bread for the World's Offering of Letters: For Such a Time as This

In the last 25 years, the world has reduced *by more than half* the number of people living in extreme poverty. Hunger and poverty have also been reduced in our own country. Last year, advocates helped avert dramatic cuts to domestic anti-hunger programs and prevented extreme cuts to emergency international humanitarian assistance. In fact, Bread for the World's letters, along with those from churches and other groups, helped win an additional \$1 billion in funding to address the near-famine crises that arose in several countries in Africa and the Middle East.

In 2018, however, Congress is expected to again propose deep cuts to vital programs that help people who are struggling with hunger and poverty in the United States. These might include programs such as WIC and SNAP (formerly food stamps) that provide food to families and senior citizens who are temporarily struggling to obtain adequate nutrition.

Congress will also consider cuts to international humanitarian and development assistance programs that fight famines, provide nutrition for mothers and children, and help struggling farm families increase their output and incomes.

The Offering of Letters gives us the opportunity to put our faith into action and make sure that everyone is fed. Please join us on April 29th and write or sign letters to our members of Congress. Our advocacy does make a difference!

2018 Hunger Projects

from PC(USA) Presbyterian Hunger Program

sponsored by HB's Hunger, Justice and Earth Care Ministry

This year, funds raised from the Hunger Dinner and two yard sales will support the following two hunger projects.

1. Alliance for International Reforestation (AIR), Guatemala: Implementing sustainable farming with Maya farmers and schools in Quiche, Guatemala:

Rural families in Guatemala have been pushed to farming food crops on mountain slopes over several decades due to the fact that rich valley farmland has been confiscated by corporations for growing export crops-onions, melons, broccoli, carnations and roses. Consequently, Mayan farmers often plant crops in unsustainable ways such as slash-and-burn farming of steep mountain slopes. As a result, soil erosion: depletes the soil and soil fills streams; causes frequent mudslides; diminishes crop yields causing malnutrition; results in loss of trees and animal habitat and impacts climate change as forests disappear. Impact on Mayan families is also psychological as they find themselves powerless to feed their families.

This project will:

- a. Provide 40 additional families in Quiche with training;*
- b. Establish four new permanent tree nurseries for native trees including tools, seed and supplies.*
- c. Establish native tree nursery and organic vegetable garden at local rural schools with corresponding textbooks.*
- d. Improve nutrition and health of these families and their neighbors who will also learn new farming methods and begin planting beneficial trees.*

2. Association Fenix, Nicaragua: Improving the conditions of school gardens for the production and preparation of food in four rural schools in Nicaragua.

This project will:

- a. Allow the development of school gardens in four rural schools to grow vegetables for students and providing tools, fencing and irrigation system.*
- b. Provide a training plan that will generate changes in attitudes and behavior in regard to the environment and food, focusing on sustainable production as well as nutritional and environmental education.*
- c. Use orchards by teachers as a didactic resource for content development and practical experimentation.*


