## LOVE THY NEIGHBOR

The theme of the year for youth group is “Love Thy Neighbor”. The kick-off was a retreat at Cedar Ridge Camp at the beginning of September. We talked about who are our neighbors and how do we love our neighbors. Our neighbors can be anyone, not just those who live beside us or look like us. Loving our neighbors can be difficult if we do not get to know our neighbors.

In the past two years, I have watched the youth group serve the homeless once a month on Wednesday evenings. At first, many of the youth seemed nervous and stood close to the cars. This past year, I watched the youth greet, shake hands, and hug our homeless neighbors. The youth spent much time listening to their stories and getting to know the people they served.

This year, we have decided to get to know our neighbors from other faiths. We will study different faiths and visit different places of worship. It is difficult to love neighbors when you do not know them. The list of different faiths includes Baha’i, Jewish, Islam, Buddhist, Hindu, Jehovah’s Witness, and many more.

We are also looking at partnerships with other churches this year, like Beulah Presbyterian and the Korean Presbyterian Youth. There are plans for more Presbytery Youth activities. Through all these activities we will learn about our neighbors.

Please consider connecting with the youth through chaperoning activities, leading an activity on Wednesday evening, transporting youth to places of worship, providing a meal, or using whatever gift you have and connect with the youth. It is so very important for the youth to be connected to many adults. They need adult mentors in their life to help them make good choices.

## NOTES FROM SESSION

### HBPres Vision Statement

Harvey Browne Church is a community of Believers that glorifies God and honors tradition as it seeks new ways of growing in faith, sharing our beliefs and putting our faith into practice.

### HBPres Purpose Statement

**HBPres** is called to make a difference by making disciples who faithfully follow Jesus, study the Bible, and love one another by serving our neighbors.

The Session of **HBPres** met for our annual retreat at Law's Lodge at Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary on Friday & Saturday, August 23-24, 2019. During Friday evening John Odom, Presbyter for Community Life, led the Session in discussion of what it means to be a Ruling Elder. On Saturday we discussed some of the results of the *Holy Cow!* survey. Later Saturday morning we held a stated meeting and the following business was handled:

- Approved communion dates for 2020.
- Received financial report as of June 30, 2019.
- Approved Dee Wade, honorably retired pastor from Anchorage Presbyterian, as visiting minister on September 22, 2019.
- Approved moving to one Christmas Eve service. Time to be determined.
- Approved the annual distribution of the Sally Jones Endowment Fund, \$4,715.75, to be paid to Montreat for credit to the Marilyn Jones Endowment Fund. This money will act as start-up money for this fund which will be used toward establishing a program to have a summer worship intern in Montreat.
- Elected Jim Boswell and Veda Pendleton as commissioners to the September 23 Presbytery meeting and Betsy Frentz and Jim Boswell to the November 16 Presbytery meeting.

A called session meeting was held on Sunday, August 25 at 10:00 AM when we welcomed Lenore Buroughs and Jeannette Priebe as new members to **HBPres**.

The next stated meeting will be October 1, 2019.


## BOOKANALIA




## LAST FOOD TRUCK FRIDAY ON OCTOBER 25

## DO'S & DON'TS OF RECYCLING

Recycling is important, but make sure you are doing it right so that your good intentions aren't wasted! Here are some guidelines:

- *Don't bundle any items in bags. Grocery sacks and can liners can get hung up on equipment in sorting facilities.*
- *Avoid single-use plastic bags. If you do use some, return to the store's collection spot. Make it a habit to use re-usable bags.*
- *Flatten cardboard boxes, newsprint and junk mail. Keep the paper from getting wet or soiled.*
- *Glass should be rinsed with caps removed. Try to avoid breaking bottles and jars.*
- *Avoid fouling up clean recycling, such as dropping a cigarette butt down a bottle. Once an item is soiled, it's garbage.*
- *Watch your hauler's instructions on plastics. They aren't the same across the region. Replace bottle lids before dropping in the bin. Some haulers only accept plastic bottles with necks.*
- *Contamination in your bin is a no-no. Keep these things OUT of your recycling: food scraps, yard waste, batteries, greasy pizza box lids, styrofoam, clothing, shoes, toys, wet paper towels, metal tools, nails, construction debris, diabetic lancets, or any kind of diaper.*
