Grace and peace to you! I'm so glad to be in my favorite season of the year – fall. Though it is not a liturgical season, it is certainly a season that carries with it great importance in the life of the church. Beginning with World Communion Sunday, the next weeks will carry us through Stewardship, Reformation Sunday, All Saints Day, Christ the King, and Thanksgiving, and then bring us into the wonderful season of Advent. For a non-liturgical season, Fall holds great importance for the vibrancy and well-being of the church. And yet, as we know, this Fall in particular holds concern about racial injustice, the ongoing pandemic, and the upcoming election. For a season that often feels so vibrant and optimistic, this Fall for many of us feels much more precarious.

In his letter to the Philippians, Paul writes from prison to a community wrestling with issues of dissension. Conflicting factions of are creating discord within the community, and bad actors are preaching a gospel counter to the Good News Paul shares. It is a tense time, and though Paul writes from prison he encourages them to keep their minds focused on what matters. Not his imprisonment. Not the conflicting messages they are receiving. Not on the chaos around them. Rather, Paul encourages them to keep their minds focused on what is going well: namely, the Good News of God's love in Christ. "Rejoice in the Lord always", Paul says. "Again I will say rejoice!" (Philippians 4: 4)

Here within our own difficult time, where this season feels more afflicted by conflict than by vibrancy and possibility, Paul's words ring particularly true. How easy it can be for us to find ourselves absorbed by bad news. But in Philippians, Paul reminds us to keep our focus on the Good News.

"Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you." (Philippians 4: 8-9)

This October, try taking on the practice of naming the Good News active in your life. Each day, take five minutes in the morning and five in the evening to write down what you have seen that reminds you of God's grace. That reminds you of God's presence. That reminds you of the Good News. And then, with those in hand, commit yourself to embodying that Good News for others – serving, witnessing, advocating, loving.

Because even in difficult times, we can still trust in God's presence moving within and among us, inviting, encouraging and equipping us to live out God's love for this world.

NOTES FROM OCTOBER SESSION

HBPres Vision Statement

Harvey Browne Church is a community of believers that glorifies God and honors tradition as it seeks new ways of growing in faith, sharing our beliefs and putting our faith into practice.

HBPres Purpose Statement

HBPres is called to make a difference by making disciples who faithfully follow Jesus, study the Bible, and love one another by serving our neighbors.

The Session of HBPres met, through the technology of Zoom, for a stated meeting on Tuesday, October 6. After a devotion from Matthew 25 by Christine Coy Fohr the following business was handled:

- Dee Pregliasco, representing the League of Women Voters of KY that launched the Fair Maps Coalition, gave a report on the importance on Fair Maps Redistricting; which is the process of drawing new boundaries for congressional and state legislative districts. The session voted to support Fair Maps Redistricting and asking Mid-KY Presbytery to also support this cause. PC(USA) is part of the Fair Maps Coalition.
- Approved the following recommendations from the Re-opening Task Force
 - ⇒Set a tentative goal for the first in-person worship to be held 11/15/20.
 - ⇒Limit attendance at 50 and urge most to continue the safest option of remote worship.
 - ⇒Reassess regularly and suspend in-person worship if Jefferson County enters the “red” category on the state map.
 - ⇒Continue to limit church access and use outside of worship.
- Christine gave her Pastor’s Report which included sharing “Seeking to be Faithful Together: Guidelines for Presbyterians in times of Disagreement” created by the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program.
- Marcia Lewis gave a financial report. Please let me know if you would like details of this report.
- Doris Wheeler left HBPres an undesignated gift of \$61,967.75. Session approved using part of these funds to pay the remainder of her 2020 pledge and to place the balance in a Temporary Restricted Fund.
- Approved 2021 communion dates
- Watched the video “Systemic Racism Explained” and had a brief discussion. This is part of a follow up from the November Presbytery meeting and HBPres being a Matthew 25 congregation.

Female Prophets

Our Old Testament includes 17 books attributed to specific named prophets. There are 5 major prophets and 12 minor prophets, all of whom are pretty clearly identified as being male. While there are no specific books attributed to a female prophet, there are a few references for us to explore:

- The Old Testament identifies 5 females with the Hebrew word for “prophetess”.
- The New Testament adds 2 more females identified with the Greek word for “prophetess”.
- The Jewish Talmud defines 4 additional females as having had the prophetic voice, despite not being specifically identified as “prophetesses” in scripture.

Over the four Sundays in October we’ll take a look at each of these eleven women. Most of their stories are brief, but we should be able to find some interesting points for discussion.

Week 1—Introduction & Miriam

Week 2—Deborah

Week 3—Huldah and Nodiah

Week 4—Unnamed Old Testament Prophetesses, along with Anna & Jezebel from the New Testament

PRESCHOOL NEWS

We are back in school!

Things may look quite a bit different than in the past but we are back and excited about it.

It is wonderful to hear the sound of little voices and laughter again in the halls of Harvey Browne. The excitement of being back in school is in the air and possibly even more heightened than in previous years. The children are happy to be making new friends and sharing time with others that they have not seen in many months. Parents are pleased to relinquish the role of teacher to our experienced educators. Parents have also expressed their appreciation for the work that has gone into the Preschool reopening and the additional new safety precautions put in place.

Just a few of the additional safety precautions include:

1. *Wellness checks and temperature screening occur every morning in the carpool line. Children may not attend if they have any symptoms of illness or a temperature at or above 100.4°F.*
2. *Temporary walls have been added to play spaces to create two separate areas and allow for children to play with only the children in their class.*
3. *Temporary walls have been added to the foyer to create boundaries and individual spaces for each classroom especially for carpool.*
4. *Classrooms have been “streamlined” and some furniture and toys removed to allow more space and distancing as well as ease of disinfecting.*



We simply cannot say enough about the dedication of our staff. During this most challenging time, they are enthusiastic and driven to make the absolute most of the new environment. Our teachers are focused on building their classroom community and creative ways to positively impact the social, emotional, and educational development of each child.

We are pleased that we have also been able to start our Wednesday afternoon literacy program for 4 year olds and Kindergarten. This enrichment class focuses on developmentally appropriate literacy rich experiences. It also helps some of our older children transition from staying ½ day to a full day with pick up at 3:00 PM.

On a fun note, as hard as it is to believe, fall is here and the children are already getting excited about Halloween celebrations. Each class will have a fall celebration and the children able to dress up.

On behalf of our preschool families and staff, we want to express our extreme gratitude to Tim Miller and his crew, Chris Brooks and Nathaniel Potts, for their help in keeping our classrooms and building spaces clean and sanitized. Your work is appreciated and makes it possible for us to be back in the classrooms.



BOOKANALIA & BOOKTALK





FOOD PANTRY HOW-TO

Our church supports the ministry of the St. Matthews Area Ministries with donations of food, money and members' volunteer time. If anyone (a member of the church or not) needs help with basic needs, especially food, they should look into being a client. Residents of 40207 zip code may receive food and non-food items **once a month**.

- Distribution will be by appointment only for those individuals living in the 40207 and a portion of the 40220 zip codes. To Make an Appointment Call 502-893-5704 between 9:00 AM – 2:00 PM Monday, Tuesday or Thursday.
- If you are homebound, food may be brought to you once monthly.

WATCH FOR E-MAIL “SPOOFING”

It has many names: *spoofing*, *scamming*, *phishing*. All of these refer to a scammer posing as you or someone you know asking you to immediately reply to their note “because they are in a prayer meeting” or otherwise indisposed. If you reply to their message, they learn that you are responsive and they can request the purchase of things like money, gift cards, or other valuable items.

It is important to know that in these cases, your e-mail has not been hacked. But you are being targeted.

Harvey Browne has been made aware of a few instances of people receiving e-mail messages that appear to be from **HBPres** staff or other members asking for money, gift cards, or other items. **Harvey Browne staff will never ask you to purchase anything on our behalf by email!** If you receive a message requesting financial assistance or requests, please check with that person using another method (DO NOT reply to the message or click on any links). Call and speak with the person directly to confirm. If they truly need help, they will wait for a phone call.

Here are some other helpful hints:

- *Phishing e-mails and text messages may look like they're from a company or a person that you trust.*
- *Pay close attention to the e-mail address it is from — many times they mimic someone's e-mail (Example: samanthalund@hbpres.net can be mis-represented as samanthalund@inchurchmail18207.com)*
- *They often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a link or opening an attachment.*

Other red flags:

- *Bad spelling and/or poor grammar in an e-mail claiming to represent a company.*
- *Unsolicited commercial or personal request — Do you even know this person? If you do, contact that person immediately by another method (give them a call!) to make sure they truly made this request.*
