PASTORAL NOMINATING COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has continued the process of evaluating Personal Information Forms (PIFs) from the PC(USA) Church Leadership Connection (CLC).

We have each read every PIF that resulted from a match to the HB Pres Ministry Information Form (MIF) or a self-referral by a candidate. We then solicited answers from promising candidates to specific questions designed to reveal more about them and to draw out their strengths, weaknesses and personal faith journeys.

Next, we conducted video interviews with a shorter, selected list of candidates. These interviews have produced a yet more concise group of candidates that we have begun visiting in their home churches.

The sudden loss of Marianne Humphries has been difficult for us. We lost a loved and valued friend and have not yet fully come to grips with the reality of it. Her experience, patience and wisdom were of immense value and will continue to be as we move forward.

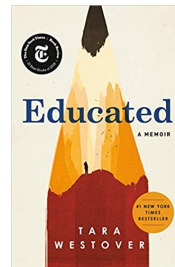
BOOKANALIA

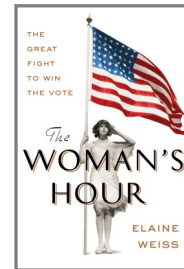

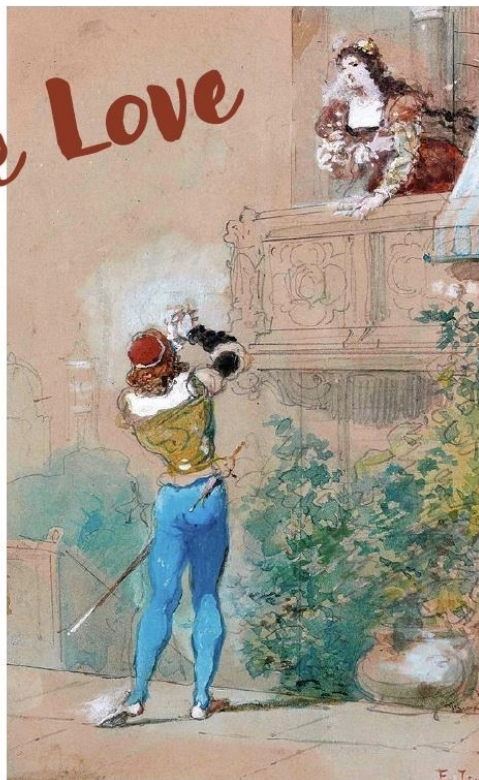
