

SUPPORT COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Support Committee of Session oversees all of the administrative work except personnel, and maintains all of the assets of the church except the endowments. In 2019, the Support Committee operated as two separate subcommittees – Building and Finance.

Finance: The Subcommittee retained an outside service to review the 2018 financial records and procedures as required by the Book of Order. The reviewers examined the church's financial reports, policies and procedures, bank and investment account statements, accounts payable disbursement records, offering and receipts records, payroll files, accounting software records, and Session minutes. The Finance Subcommittee concluded that the reported findings indicate that our processes impose appropriate controls. And with one exception, the Subcommittee has implemented, or is in the process of implementing, the reviewer's recommendations for improvement. The exception is a recommendation to voluntarily adopt new financial statement presentation standards applicable to not-for-profit organizations. The Subcommittee concluded that the transition would create disruptions and costs that are not warranted at this time.

For the first 11 months of 2019, the church's expenses exceeded its income by \$39,248. We have covered this excess from unrestricted funds that are available for day-to-day operations.

The 2019 budget projected a total annual income of \$1,059,359. Actual income from offerings for the first 11 months of 2019, was \$691,930, which is 83.74% of the annual budget target and approximately 8% below the target for the 11-month period. Income from other sources for the same period was \$233,093, which is 100% of the annual budget target. The combined actual income total of \$925,023 is 87.32% of the annual budget target and approximately 5% below the target for the 11-month period.

The 2019 budget projected total annual expenses of \$1,059,359. Actual expenses are on target. For the first 11 months of 2019, they were \$964,271, which is 91.02% of the annual budget target and approximately 1% ahead of the target for the 11-month period.

Offerings in December typically increase. We cannot, however, predict whether that historical trend will make up the entire negative cash flow over the first eleven months. Session will address these circumstances in its 2020 budget, which is in development.

The members of the Finance Subcommittee are John Johnson (Moderator), Steve Schulte, Cheryl Granger (Staff), Tom Hughes (Treasurer) and Marcia Lewis. Dee Pregliasco is a liaison with the Trustees.

Building: In the first quarter we completed the major repairs enabled by the Charles M. "Mike" Young bequest by installing a new chiller. We have significantly benefited from the new boilers and chillers in lower utility bills; also contributing to utility savings were the replacement of all windows, enabled by a gift last December. Finally, another generous bequest enabled us to repair our stained glass windows and protect them with plexiglass. Two unplanned replacements of HVAC units in the chapel area have just been completed, and as a result, our reserves for big-ticket building improvements has been completely depleted.

The biggest repair remaining, for which there is no funding, is the exterior tuckpointing from the chapel tower to the rear entrance. A structural engineer was called in to assess the problem, and we are fortunate in that it is not an issue with the foundation.

The estimate for this project is almost \$100,000.

A Building Use Policy drafted by the subcommittee was approved by Session. The building caregivers include Maggie Chilton (Moderator), Steve Schulte, Tim Miller (Staff), Dave Doehnert, Lance Christell and Al Pollock.

Technology: The lobby monitors have been restored, and our wi-fi was upgraded and unified into a single network.

KPCL Covenant: Although our relationship with the Korean congregation involves much more than a shared building, we will report it here that the new Covenant between our congregations was signed in May at the Presbytery meeting held in their sanctuary (formerly our chapel).







The paperback edition of this book is released on January 5.


