Notes from Session

The Session of **HBPres** met, through the technology of Zoom, a stated meeting on Tuesday, October 5. The following business was handled:

- Rev. Coy Fohr gave the Pastor's report.
- Reviewed Terry's report on children and youth.
- Marcia Lewis gave the financial report as of August 31, 2021.
- A Vision Fund has been set up with a goal of providing a reserve that will enable the church to pursue opportunities in congregational vitality, programming and benevolence that exceeds the scope of **HBPres'** operating budget. Session approved a recommendation from Finance Committee that Christine set up a task force to develop the purpose and guidelines for the fund.
- **HBPres** had a financial audit done for 2020. The audit was positive with a few recommendations from the auditors. Session approved Finance Committee's response to the recommendations which will be sent to the auditors. If you would like to see the recommendations please contact Anne Hughes.
- Approve 2022 communion dates.
- Approved Welcome Committee overseeing the church's website and all social media platforms of the church, excluding those of Harvey Browne Preschool. Oversight will include design, structure, and content.
- Claudette Taylor reported on business handled at the September Presbytery meeting.
- Approved **HBPres** to host the November 20, 2021 Presbytery meeting if the date is approved by the Presbytery's Coordinating Commission.
- Received into membership Barry Gene Belcher by transfer of letter from Southeast Christian Church.

Next stated meeting will be November 2, 2021.

Remembering Our Saints

“All Saints’ Day is a time to rejoice in all who through the ages have faithfully served the Lord. The day reminds us that we are part of one continuing, living communion of saints. It is a time to claim our kinship with the “glorious company of apostles ... the noble fellowship of prophets. It is a time to express our gratitude for all who in ages of darkness kept the faith, for those who have taken the gospel to the ends of the earth, for prophetic voices who have called the church to be faithful in life and service, for all who have witnessed to God’s justice and peace in every nation.

To rejoice with all the faithful of every generation expands our awareness of a great company of witnesses above and around us like a cloud (Hebrews 12:1). It lifts us out of a preoccupation with our own immediate situation and the discouragements of the present. In the knowledge that others have persevered, we are encouraged to endure against all odds (Hebrews 12:1-2). Reminded that God was with the faithful of the past, we are reassured that God is with us today, moving us and all creation toward God’s end in time. In this context, it is appropriate for a congregation on All Saints’ Day to commemorate the lives of those who died during the previous year.” An excerpt from the *Companion to the Book of Common Worship* (Geneva Press, 2003, 150-151)

Coming Soon! New Parish Associates

Rev. Walt McCanless joins us after serving 25 years as the pastor of the historic Providence Presbyterian Church in Charlotte, North Carolina. At Providence, Walt worked with Faith and Justice Co. to offer the Robinson's "Changing Our Lens" workshop; "Named the Names" of Providence's enslaved members; started and continued the Bethel Bible Series; started several Spiritual Formation groups which encourage spiritual growth among the members; worked to open a Counseling Center at the church; played midwife to the birth of the Stephen Ministry; served on advisory committee for Stop Hunger Now which packages dried food to ship to crisis situations, schools and orphanages throughout the world, and started PPC's partnership with Habitat for Humanity. Walt brings a wealth of experience in pastoral care and will primarily focus on visitation here at Harvey Browne.




Booktalk
