The season of Advent is upon us here at Harvey Browne. Already, we have changed the paraments to purple, hung the greens, and lit the candle of hope. Already, our Advent buddies had begun their fun, sharing weekly gifts with the children of our church. Already, Rev. Kubar has shared with us how God holds a place for our homesick hearts as we long for the already-but-not-yet of God's kingdom. But as you will read in this newsletter, much more is in store this Advent at **HB Pres**. I hope you will read and make note of all the ways you can connect with your church community this Advent season.

In worship, our services will be guided by the theme *Close to Home*, produced by a wonderful group called *A Sanctified Art*. *A Sanctified Art* is a collection of pastors and artists who develop liturgical resources for churches and individuals. While we will be using their "words for worship" as a resource, they also provide tools for daily devotions, liturgical art, and music, to name a few. They are truly an exciting group, and we are grateful for their work. Here is how they describe their Advent theme *Close to Home*:

When something hits close to home, it affects us deeply. During the Advent and Christmas season, we journey through scriptures and rituals that are tender, heavy with emotion, and vulnerable. We carry the memories and truths of this season close to our hearts. The *Close to Home* theme acknowledges the "already but not yet" tension of our faith: Emmanuel is with us, and yet, God's promised day—our everlasting home—is not fully realized. It names our deep longing for God to come close to us.

The Advent and Christmas scriptures are rich with home metaphors and imagery. In these scriptures, home is both physical and metaphorical, something we seek and something we are called to build. In many ways, these scriptures are like blueprints—detailing the dreams of a God who makes a home with us. Ultimately, God is our home and resting place. God draws near and makes a home on earth; sacred ground is all around us.

This Advent, may we be comforted by the One who dwells intimately with us. May we expand safety and sanctuary for everyone wandering far from home. May we come home—wherever home is found—to live fully with joy, hope, and courage.

May it be so!

- Reviewed reports from committees






Coffee and Chocolate!

Dear HBPres family,

I want to thank the great number of you who sent me thoughtful notes upon the recent death of my mother. She was a wonderful and caring woman. Mom was a devoted Presbyterian and was at church every Sunday until she could no longer attend due to health issues. She was famous for her pimento cheese and must have made thousands of sandwiches for funerals and wedding receptions over the years. She had a great sense of humor which enabled her to tolerate me. She was driving until she was 94 and still balancing her checkbook until a few months before she died. Over 100 people attended her graveside service, pretty remarkable since Wagram has only about 300 people. My brother was her primary caregiver for the last 5 years of her life. My sister was also very generous with her time and care. I will always be grateful to mom for all the love she showered on her children and also for her patient and loving care for my dad as he struggled with Parkinson's prior to his death.
