


# Making a Difference

Everyone loves a good story. Whether it is a child being read to before bedtime or a page-turner on the beach, stories invite us to find ourselves in new, never-before imagined worlds: flying on a dragon over an imaginary land, solving a mystery with friends, climbing in a treetop and being carried through time. Stories invite us to expand our imagination, but at the same time, they help us reorient our world. Even if the setting is distant or the timeline is in the future or past, stories nonetheless impact us—here and now. This fall, we’re hoping to dig into the epic story of God’s love and see how it might impact us.

Starting on September 11, we will be switching from the usual Revised Common Lectionary—the 3-year cycle of scripture readings that help pastors and worship leaders plan worship services—to the Narrative Lectionary—a new, 4 year cycle that aims to communicate scripture as a broad story. We will begin in the book of Genesis, traveling through Exodus to the prophets this fall. Following Christmas, we will shift to readings from the gospels, eventually concluding with Acts and the epistles. Through it all, the hope is that we will understand more deeply the broad story of God’s love: love formed in covenant, love that works for liberation, love made incarnate in Jesus Christ, and love that guides how we live by the power of the Holy Spirit.



### Bookanalia



choir director has been murdered. Chief Inspector Gamache and Jean-Guy Beauvoir are challenged to find the killer.


### Pastor's Book Club

## Presbyterian Women


You're invited and welcome to join us for the Presbyterian Women's 2022-2023 Bible Study.

### \*\* THE GAIA MOVEMENT

The main purpose of Gaia Movement is to keep clothing out of landfills. 85% of our clothing ends up in landfills or is burned. Furthermore, it is estimated that the average American throws away about 70 pounds of clothes every year. Manufacturers overproduce the supply of clothing, and retailers end up overstocked-- as seasons change, the unsold supply often ends up in landfills. Manufacturers are in control of what fibers they use in their textiles, and they are in control of how much product they produce. The fashion industry overproduces products by about 30-40% each season, which contributes roughly 10% of all global carbon emissions and is the world's second worst offender in terms of water and plastic pollution. The synthetic fibers in our clothes are made from crude oil such as synthetic (plastic) fibers including polyester, nylon and acrylic. The Gaia Movement has a different take on landfilling clothing. Through their recycling and repurposing. Cotton and wool can be rewoven into new clothing. Nylon and polyester can be reprocessed into pellets to make new clothing. These are just a few of the ways Gaia repurposes fabrics.

## Property Committee Update

You may have noticed fencing surround the beautiful cross in our memorial garden. Earlier this summer, one of the glass pieces of the cross fell and shattered on the concrete. Pieces could be found as far as the gym wall. The Property Committee is looking into any safety concerns we may need to be aware of regarding the structure of the cross. Session has approved roping off the area for the time being out of an abundance of caution for the children and elderly neighbors (from the nursing facility next door) who regularly use the area. We will keep the congregation aware of what we learn as we learn it.



## Coffee, Chocolate and Crafts

Our Advent event will soon be here and we want to make sure everyone has it on their calendar! For anyone new to Harvey Browne, this is an annual event which is a fund raiser for Congo Schools. Eleven schools have been completed and much has been done in the areas of renovations, teacher training, the purchase of textbooks and transportation (a motorbike) for the school supervisor. The 1<sup>st</sup> sale will be December 4<sup>th</sup> at **HBPres**, the 2<sup>nd</sup> on December 11<sup>th</sup> at Anchorage and the 3<sup>rd</sup> at **HBPres** on December 18<sup>th</sup>. As usual, we will have baked goods and welcome all contributions! Any other sort of craft such as carving, sculpting, knitting, handiwork, etc. is also very welcome.



## Congo Schools Update

School #10 has been completed. Harvey Browne has helped with the construction of these schools as well as the renovation of others through funds raised by our Advent craft fair. One other aspect of the Congo School Project has been scholarships to cover the cost of tuition, uniforms, fees, and school supplies. As indicated, funds are most needed for orphans and other vulnerable children. \$80 will cover all costs for a child in either elementary or secondary school. Each year can have a major impact on a child's life in a country where education is at a premium.
