## Service Worship Sunday, October 30th

Look up at the top of our newsletter. See what it says? *Making a Difference*. These words are included in Harvey Browne’s mission statement. They are printed on the backs of our t-shirts. *Making a Difference*. What does that mean to you?



If you expand the phrase in our mission statement, you’ll see that it says, *Making a difference by making disciples*. So the difference made is linked to discipleship — to drawing people into a radically new way of living. What does that look like to you?

When I think about this “making a difference by making disciples” I think about last month, when I had the chance to serve alongside our mission trip participants in Dawson Springs, Kentucky. Watching that group share the love of Christ by hanging drywall, picking up debris, and cleaning up roof damage was powerful. While wearing those Harvey Browne t-shirts, they were *making a difference by making disciples* — by offering a powerful witness to how Christ’s love changes us, commissioning us to worship God in all we say and do.

This month, we are all invited to live into our church’s mission statement through an exciting day we are calling “Service Worship Sunday.” On Sunday, October 30th, we will worship God through service. Our Outreach and Mission Committee have organized dozens of service activities — both here on our church campus and around town. Projects will be available for all ages and abilities, from writing cards to baking cookies for first-responders to working construction on Cedar Ridge camp’s new chapel. Through all of them, we will be invited to live into our discipleship call to make a difference through discipleship, worshipping God with our hands and feet, heart and mind.

How will this work, logistically? Throughout the month of October, you will have the chance to sign up for the service project of your choice. Sign-ups will be available online as well as before and after worship on Sundays. Activities will also be available for our church members who worship from home or who are unable to come to the church on October 30th.

On the morning of October 30th, we will begin together at 10:30, in the sanctuary. After a brief time of commissioning, we will be sent out to continue our worship through service. We hope you are excited to participate. Together, let’s make a difference by making disciples, both here at Harvey Browne and beyond.

## Fire Prevention Week – Oct 9 to Oct 15

What was that noise on Rally Day? For many, that was the first time hearing the church's fire alarm and this wasn't a drill. Besides questions about what the noise was we also heard "Is this for real?" Everyone exited safely and the fire department resolved the issue but let's look at a few observations.

- It's not important to discern if this is "real." Response to an alarm or a drill will be the same.
- Leave the building through the closest "Exit." Walking through the width of the building could create a hazardous situation. It is helpful to know where the exits are from a room, orienting occupants at the start of a meeting would be best practice. Do you know where you would exit the Sanctuary if the alarm occurred during worship, without using an elevator?
- Moving away from the building creates "fire lanes" for the fire department to use as they arrive.
- Proceed safely to a single destination away from the building. This would be in the distant part of our parking lot adjacent to the church manse, currently Dr. Wiley's dental office. A common gathering point helps us locate each other and parents can reunite with their children. If you decide to leave the church property let someone know.
- It's going to take awhile even if there isn't a fire. The fire department has certain protocols to follow before declaring "all clear."

Everything ended well on Rally Day and we were provided an opportunity for a practice session. Next time you visit the church note the spot outside where you would go if there was a fire and point this out to your kids. Notice the exits from the rooms you occupy. Locate a fire alarm pull and where there is a fire extinguisher. Congratulations on a safe evacuation.




## Offering Envelopes

A Thank you note from Bill Williamson:



The Session of Harvey Browne Presbyterian Church held a stated hybrid meeting on September 6. Following an opening prayer by Sarah Zuber the following business was handled:

- Christine gave her Pastor's report.
- Terry Hargrave submitted her report on Tweens and Youth. Terry would like 3 volunteers to be mentors to the youth in this year's confirmation class.
- Heard reports from the committees.
- Approved the wedding of Arthur Paxton Rousseau and Sydney Paige Hawkins on December 9, 2023, Rev. Kim Cabrera officiating.
- Approved the following recommendation from our COVID Safety Task Force:
  - \* As we continue to strive for safety from COVID for our entire HBPres family we realize that at this time in the pandemic it has become a personal decision on what is best for each person. When there is an elevated community COVID level we strongly encourage wearing a mask and remaining away from others if feeling ill. We will continue to offer a section in the sanctuary for social distancing with alternate row seating and masking required. However, we welcome others to make the choice which is best for them in other parts of the sanctuary or church building. Committees should be encouraged to evaluate ways to make all people feel safe in activities such as "Time with Young Disciples", food, ushering, and communion by offering options for those wanting a higher level of safety.

Next stated meeting is scheduled for October 4.
