

It has been an absolute delight reading this month's Pastors' Book Club book, *The Book of Joy*. Comprised of conversations between the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu over a week spent together, *The Book of Joy* engages the question how one can find joy within a difficult world. It is embarrassing how many lines of my book are underlined, but I think it speaks to how difficult it can feel to find joy now. We are bombarded with reasons to feel anxious, depressed, and angry. What a gift to find a book that not only brings joy but that helps us take steps to sustain it.

One of the early lines I starred offered practical advice from the Dalai Lama. "Even ten minutes or thirty minutes of meditating on compassion, on kindness for others, and you will see its effects all day. That's the way to maintain a calm and joyous mind." Archbishop Tutu grounds his practice in the African concept of Ubuntu: that a person is a person through other persons; and in caring for the other, one finds joy for oneself.



The popular author Brené Brown writes quite a bit the nature of joy, exploring specifically how it is linked to gratitude. She writes,

*The relationship between joy and gratitude was one of the important things I found in my research. I wasn't expecting it. In my 12 years of research on 11,000 pieces of data, I did not interview one person who had described themselves as joyful who also did not actively practice gratitude. For me it was very counterintuitive because I went into the research thinking that the relationship between joy and gratitude was: if you are joyful, you should be grateful. But it wasn't that way at all. Instead, practicing gratitude invites joy into our lives.*

I can't think of a better invitation for us in a time like this: to invite joy by practicing gratitude. By shifting our focus onto our interconnectedness with others, onto the gift of the people with whom we share this world.

November 13<sup>th</sup> will be Pledge Sunday here at Harvey Browne. Maybe giving to the church is a way you express your gratitude. Maybe it is through volunteering or service or baking for others or saying prayers. Whatever it is, this month may you broaden your horizons to see your connectedness with all God's people. May you give thanks for that and, in doing so, may you find joy.

## Many Ways To Give

I had to write a check recently. It was all I could do to remember how. I now live in a cashless community – not just checks, but no cash, no credit cards. The monthly payment is taken from my bank account, and any extra services that were provided are added to the monthly bill.

Harvey Browne has provided a few easy ways to give (and they are easy for the staff to receive) that don't involve writing checks and buying postage stamps. You can donate through the church website by providing your credit card. You can donate a direct withdrawal from your bank (this is safe, I did it for a few years); you provide your account information to Cheryl in the office. You can donate from your IRA, and this is what I am doing now. Any of these methods can be for one-time only, or a recurring donation can be set up.

I discovered a couple of years ago that the standard tax deduction increased to the point where I no longer needed to itemize deductions on my tax return. However, I can still get a tax deduction for a charitable contribution if it comes from my IRA account and goes directly to the church. That means I get the standard deduction on my tax return, and I also get a "deduction" (this part of the IRA withdrawal is not taxable) for something I used to itemize. Some retirees get another benefit – the amount that goes to charity counts towards the minimum required distribution, which is the money you have to withdraw whether or not you need it, once you reach the age when this is required. Check with your IRA account manager if you need more information.

And if you are looking for additional methods of giving that we don't currently offer, be sure to let the Finance Committee know.


### Booktalk

## Sharing Our Journey

The **Sharing Our Journey** Sunday School Class continues to use the PCUSA *Follow Me Study Guide* to enhance our knowledge and growth as disciples of Jesus. Beginning November 23<sup>rd</sup>, we begin a four week study entitled, *Sing a New Song*. This unit explores how God's people use song in moments of liberation, tribulation, and transformation to witness God's new creation being revealed in their midst. The Session of Harvey Browne Presbyterian Church held a stated hybrid meeting on October 4. Following an opening prayer by Ben Blake the following business was handled:

- Larry Brandenburg gave his Minister of Music report.

Following recommendations from committees were approved:

- Finance Committee recommendation to close the Minister Benevolence Fund Stockyard Bank checking account. Funds in this account will be moved to appropriate Endowment Distribution Account
- Finance Committee recommendation to issue Iona Moore, Food Service Director, a credit card for purchasing supplies.
- Welcome Committee recommendations to change the church's logo to be in line with session's previous approval to use Harvey Browne Presbyterian Church rather than **HBPres** on all external communications.
- Finance Committee will include financial highlights of our income for the month and year in weekly highlights and newsletter.
- Finance Committee shared the results of our financial review by Laura Olliges, CPA and Tim Stepp, CPA for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2021. It was a positive report with a few minor recommendations. The full report can be found in the Session Minutes book in the church office.
- Harvey Browne will be hosting the Tri-Presbytery Meeting November 10-11, 2023.
- Commissioners to the November 12, 2022, Presbytery meeting will be Jim Boswell and Anne Hughes.

Next stated meeting is scheduled for November 1.

## Issues Class on Mass Incarceration November 6th

Our second Issues class will focus on Mass Incarceration. The speaker is Bonifacio Aleman, Health Equity Program Manager for LifeSpring Health Systems, of Southern Indiana. As a formerly incarcerated person, he spent 11 years in prison. Since that time Bonifacio has earned a Master's degree at the Spalding School of Social Work and is now a doctoral student researching health equity, mass incarceration and post-incarceration trauma. He has spearheaded three pieces of local legislation in Louisville including the "Ban the Box" Ordinance and the Resolution in Support of Restoration of Voting Rights. In 2021 he spoke on a PCUSA panel on "Mass Incarceration and the Church". Come join us in Eline Hall after church as we learn more about this important topic. A light lunch will be served. ## Beloved Community

On September 17 the steering committee of the Beloved Community met. The following are some topics that were discussed:

**AFRICAN AMERICAN CHURCH LENTEN SERIES** – People who attended these church visits last Spring were enthusiastic about how they were welcomed and how much they appreciated and learned about each church. It gave each church an opportunity to invite people from the Presbytery to learn about their history and ministry. Dianne described some of the program Shawnee Presbyterian presented. As the only church of the series that has transitioned from an all- white church, they gave an honest history of the racial discrimination in the church in the 60's and in the neighborhood where children of color were not allowed into the popular Fountain Ferry Amusement Park. Sarah Grant from HB gave her account of the racial situation when her father was a minister there in the 60's. She recalled that African American children were not allowed into the church's Boy Scout Troop and other discriminations.

**HOPE BUSS UPDATE** – Dianne reported that assimilating the Hope Buss, the largest growing nonprofit in the city, into their church is akin to “birthing a baby.” There are labor pains as they make room for the growing needs of the Hope Buss while still facing renovation issues. Shawnee cooks lunch and dinner for the 40 people at the Hope Village each Wednesday. Kitty asked what Harvey Browne is doing to help with this work. Dianne said that our help has been “monumental” in our monetary support. Our church has sent the Presbytery's offering from its meeting at our church, our PW has supported the Hope Buss, a special Sunday offering went to the Hope Buss and the Pentecost offering for the last six years has gone to Shawnee for its outreach. This has translated into thousands of dollars. Also, some Harvey Browne members and our youth group have helped cook meals for the Hope Village. We will continue to find ways to support Shawnee and the Hope Buss.

**EMPOWER WEST** – Christine reported on an Empower West meeting at St. Stephen's Church. She said it was an inspiring coming together of black and white church leaders. This organization, which has been around for several years, has as its mission to unleash the educational, economic, and spiritual power of West Louisville. Her take-away from the meeting was the importance of white churches looking at their mission money and directing some monies to black run non-profits.
