Advent Devotionals- Pick-up your copy of the Presbyterian Outlook's Advent Devotional *Attending to Advent: Poetry, Prose and Prayer* on the Welcome Center. The weeks leading up to Christmas can be hectic and full. The opportunity to pause and attend to Advent can get lost amid preparations for the big holiday, vacation plans or end-of-year work. This daily devotional invites readers to pause and reflect on narratives in the Christmas story. Daily readings will take us deeper into the scriptural story of the birth of Christ and explore contemporary subjects like parenting, power, war and violence, vulnerability, innocence, and the many ways God's incarnation can be experienced.

Advent Devotional Bags - Each bag contains 8 devotional cards (2 per week) and small items that go with each devotional lesson. Each brief devotion offers a scripture passage, questions for reflection, and an activity. These purple bags are available in the narthex. Anyone is welcome and encouraged to take part in this Advent devotional!

HBUiversity & Sharing Our Journey This Advent- For the season of Advent, the HBUiversity and Sharing Our Journey Sunday school classes will be combining to explore Dr. Amy-Jill Levine's book, *Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent*. In this study, author, professor, and biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the story of the birth of Jesus. These stories open conversations around connections of the Gospel stories to the Old Testament, the role of women in first-century Jewish culture, the importance of Mary's visitation and the revolutionary implications of Mary's Magnificat, the census and the stable, and the star of Bethlehem and the flight to Egypt. People can participate by reading the book or by simply coming for the class. We have ordered 15 copies of the book, which will be available in the church office or in the classroom

Booktalk- on Tuesday, **November 29** at 11:30 on Zoom and in the Living Room will be *Matrix* by Lauren Groff. A 17-year-old girl becomes prioress of an abbey, and a lot of changes are in store.
