This past February, my husband Rob declared with all of the confidence of a man raised in Arizona, "I think the groundhog got it wrong!" Punxsutawney Phil had emerged on February 2, only to see his shadow and run back into his burrow, predicting, as tradition holds, that there would be six more weeks of winter. But here in Kentucky, we were experiencing an early spring — weeks in the 70s with the sun shining brightly in the sky. For someone not from Kentucky, Rob felt confident that winter was over and sunnier days were ahead. As a native Kentuckian, though, I knew not to hold my breath.

It is not by accident that our liturgical calendar always lines up with the seasons of the northern hemisphere – that Lent coincides with dreary skies while Easter (we hope) is celebrated with flowers blooming and leaves bursting forth on the trees. Some years, of course, that doesn't quite play out, and those flowery Easter dresses are donned on bitterly chilly Easter mornings. But somehow, at least for me, these two seasons are in-sync. The contemplative weeks of Lent wrapping up with a warm Easter greeting at the end.

This year, it turned out that the groundhog did, indeed, get it right. Despite those sunny days of warmth in February, what we Kentuckians know as "second winter" came around, keeping our Lent cold and gray. And what Easter will bring, even the groundhog cannot say. We may well be flowering our cross out front in winter coats, with kids doing egg hunts while dodging the cold. Regardless of the weather, though, the promise of Easter remains the same – that no matter the pain this world holds, death does not have the final say. Suffering, grief, and gray skies – they do not win in the end. For life has won. Love has won. And no matter the weather, that good news is cause for celebration.

Holy Week falls this year in the first week of April, and it will take us from Jesus' Triumphal entry in Jerusalem through the story of his final meal, his betrayal, his death, and his blessed resurrection. I hope that you will join us for the services in that special week. For many of us, it doesn't get more meaningful than worshipping together from Palm Sunday to Maundy Thursday with communion and the stripping of the church, through the Tenebrae service on Good Friday and eventually to Easter morning—with or without sunny weather. To find the schedule, check out the back of this month's newsletter. All services will be streamed online, and the nursery will be provided, as well.

Newsletter Change

The church office currently uses the Unites States Postal Services Bulk Mail system to mail the Harvey Browne Newsletter. In order to utilize the bulk mail system, we must mail at least 200 newsletters. While the price is deeply discounted, the delivery time—sometimes up to three weeks—has gotten too long to be useful. However, the cost to mail the same amount of newsletters using the regular first-class mail is not sustainable financially. So, we need to start over from scratch.



Beginning in June, we will send newsletters by regular mail to those who 1) are not able to view the newsletter online and 2) are not able to pick up a printed copy at the church. While we know the amount is more expensive, we are hoping that by not having to print so many newsletters, we will save money. We are encouraging everyone to view the newsletter online if they can. The newsletter is much prettier online, since it is in full color, and we can save money each month in paper and printing costs.

In the meantime, the church needs to know how you would like to receive your newsletter! If you would like a mailed copy, or if you plan to pick up a print version at the church, please contact the church office and let us know how. It is very important for us to know how many plan to pick-up the newsletter at church so that we can ensure that we are printing enough copies. **We only need one response per family.** (If you prefer to view the newsletter online, no need to reach out.)

Please let us know your preference by May 15. If you do not use email, please call Cheryl in the church office and tell her how you want to view the newsletter.






April Grocery Cart

Philippians is often seen as an "epistle of joy," and indeed it is—yet Paul writes with definite ideas about what this beloved congregation needs to do differently. Perceiving both internal and external threats to the congregation's thriving, Paul strives to show faithful



people who find themselves living in this threatened space—including us—how to produce "the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God" (1:11).

Dr. Sue Garrett will lead us in discussion of this letter April 16, 23, 30 and May 7.



Sharing Our Journey

We will complete our discussions of the book *Meeting Jesus at the Table* on April 16 & 23.

Beginning April 30th, Dave Doehnert will facilitate discussions based on the a docuseries released by the Presbyterian Mission Agency. *Trouble the Water: Conversations to Disrupt Racism and Dominance*, features four episodes that challenge viewers to think, listen and work together to disrupt the systems that perpetuate racism. It consists of Episode 1: *Why Us? Why Now?* Episode 2: *Whiteness*, Episode 3: *Racial Identity*, and Episode 4: *Intersectionality and Disruption*.

"Trouble the Water amplifies voices and counterstories that challenge the dominant narratives and colonial myths that continue to perpetuate systems of oppression and dehumanization," said Director David Barnhart, who has completed several other films, such as *Flint: The Poisoning of an American* City and *Trigger: The Ripple Effect of Gun Violence*, as part of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance's Story Productions. "I hope that groups can gather around these stories, listen deeply to one another, collectively explore these issues and questions, and take concrete steps together toward building Beloved Community."

Music Ministry Notes

April brings the promise of new life as the warming weather of spring awakens the sleeping earth with green grass, blooms and the sounds of nature. April also brings us Holy Week and Easter. Holy Week prepares us for the promise of new life that we celebrate on Easter Day.

We will begin Holy Week on April 2 with the Children's Choir leading a Palm Procession and singing a wonderful "Hosanna" accompanied with trumpet. The Chancel Choir will continue this triumphant theme with another "Hosanna" also with trumpet.

But the Hosannas fade as we face the reality of Good Friday. The Tenebrae Service combines readings from scripture interspersed with congregational hymns and choral reflections. This is a powerful presentation of the Passion story. As we leave in darkness our faith has been shaken.

But we return on Sunday, April 9, to a Sanctuary bright with hope and join our voices with brass as we joyfully release our Alleluias in hymns of praise. And we close out this celebration with everyone joining on the Hallelujah Chorus from Handel's Messiah.

April is here. New life is here. Come join the celebration.



Easter Breads



"In many parts of the world Easter is the most joyously celebrated of all Christian holidays. In these Countries the first meal after midnight ends the long, solemn days of austere Lenten fasting. Traditionally, women around the world have helped make this meal a glorious occasion with beautifully decorated eggs, colorful coffee cakes, and delicate sweet breads. On this day Italian's bake their bread in the shape of a dove, the symbol of peace. In Greek villages tables display rings of bread topped with crimson eggs. Russian women carry tall, round Kulich to church for a priestly blessing before sharing it with family and friends. Bread, since the early days of Christianity, has marked the beginning of the splendid feast of Easter."

Easter is April 9, 2023. Presbyterian Women will host an Easter Breads Celebration in Emory from 9:00-10:15 AM before our Easter Worship Service. We need help from the congregation, men, women and families to provide the breads. Har-

vey Browne's cookbook has a section or go on the Internet to find interesting Easter Bread recipes. Perhaps it could become a new family tradition to bake bread together. We will accept any type of bread you want to share with the entire congregation. Bring breads cut, plated, and covered April 8 from 12:30-2:00 PM or April 9 at 9 AM to Emory Hall (gym). 



