# Making a Difference Harvey Browne Memorial Presbyterian Church Newsletter May 2023

Maybe it's that it's finally springtime...or that Pentecost is this month... whatever it is, I am feeling excited about our church. In fact, I'm feeling downright evangelical about it. This church is such a beautiful expression of the Body of Christ here in Louisville. The people here are warm and welcoming, thoughtful and heartfelt; they don't shy from questions yet have a deep bedrock of faith guiding them. And above all, the people here are genuine. Nothing fake or pretentious. Just caring folks seeking deep relationship with God and one another. In my opinion, this world could use more places like Harvey Browne.

A 2012 study from Barna Research Group says that, across denominations and church traditions, six in ten young people will leave the church or take an extended break starting at age 15. That's 60% of the young people currently being raised in church, coming from strong families of faith. 60% will leave.

Why? They feel that church is isolationist, demonizing everything not officially "Christian." They also feel church exists in a bubble, never addressing real, pressing issues. A large number of young people are turned off by a perception that church is anti-science, and a majority feel that churches are segregated and lack diversity. And finally, while a quarter of young people have serious doubts they would like to thoughtfully discuss with someone, a third feel that church is not a safe place for asking questions or expressing doubt.

But what's more, these observations do not end with youth. More and more parents of young children choose involvement in secular organizations over religious ones due to similar fears. For people raised in more fundamentalist traditions, they often do not realize that there are, in fact, churches where wrestling with one's faith is ok. Where doubt is not demonized and questions are not unwelcome. The choice seems clear: either stay in church or leave altogether.

Which is why I am feeling so evangelical about our congregation. Again and again, people tell me that this place is like a balm for wounds inflicted by other churches and traditions; that they love the thought we put into our faith; that people here seem strong in what they believe and express it through service and mission; and that they wish we could get the word out so more folks could find their way here.

On May 14<sup>th</sup>, we will recognize our confirmands during our Sunday worship service. Over the past year, they have examined their faith and asked great questions. Above all, I hope they have received this message: that this church loves them, and that their curiosity is welcome here.

What would it be like if we got this word out to our broader community – if we were a bit more evangelical about our community of faith? We could always use more programs or strengthen certain areas of our church, but I think that we have a powerful gift to share with our community: caring folks seeking deep relationship with God and one another.

So, spread the word! You never know who might need this community to call home.



of Louisville, was funded primarily through the 1953 Birthday Offering. Presbyterian Women built a modern new facility in 1964 on the grounds of the Louisville Presbyterian Seminary, raising enough money that the debt was paid off in less than a year! With the sale of a portion of the Seminary property, this building was recently razed. A new building is planned—come learn more about it!
