How many times have you left a film feeling deeply moved? Perhaps you were inspired by the characters or the situation, and the film has left you energized. Perhaps you were moved emotionally, and left the film more appreciative of family or loved ones. Or perhaps the film made you laugh out loud, an experience we could all use more in our lives.

Films are pieces of art with a unique ability to affect us, and they are particularly adept at affecting our lives of faith. While some movies are intentionally faith-based, even those that are not explicitly so still possess the power to deepen themes we learn here in the context of church. We can learn about right relationships, remembrance, sacrifice, justice, wholeness—all through the power of film.

This month, we are going to have some fun exploring particular films in worship. We will lift up themes of faith rooted in scripture, so even if you can't watch the film, you won't miss a beat. Notes from Session

The Session of Harvey Browne Presbyterian Church held a stated meeting on June 20. Following an opening prayer by Kim Harrod the following business was handled:

- Session previously approved, via email vote, to have the following Rev. Wal McCanless, Rev. Mark Barnes, Rev. Tim Cargal and Inquirer Meg Buckner preach during June & July.
- We also approved, via email vote, the recommendation from Property & Finance committees to use Pure Foam Roofing to repair the roof over Eline Hall at a cost of \$19855.00. The cost will be covered by this year's Trustee Distribution to the Eline Building Fund and the Maintenance budget.
- Approved new flooring for the PDO/Nurse classrooms. Some rooms will be done this summer at a cost of \$9173.86 and the last room will be completed the summer of 2024 at a cost of \$4300.00. The cost will be covered by funds in the Jeremiah 29 Fund.
- Approved increasing Katherine Kuper's hours as Parish Associate beginning August 1.
- Approved the job description for Director of Youth Ministries to replace Terry Hargrave who has announced her retirement.

Once you enter your email address follow the directions on the screen to complete the login process. After you login, the directory will be downloaded to your device. Anytime updates are made, they will update on your device too. Don't have a photo in the directory or don't like the one that's there? You can upload a new photo right on the app.

Grocery Cart

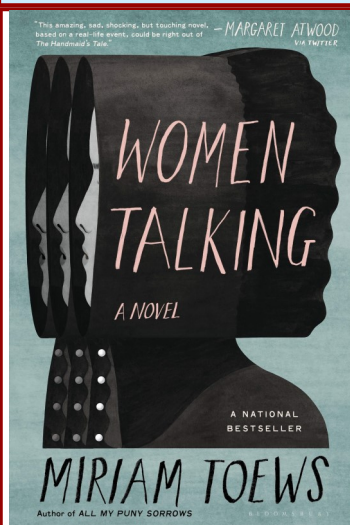
The Grocery Cart for July is for St. Matthew Area Ministries (St. MAM).

Booktalk for Tuesday, July 25 at 11:30am in the living room and on Zoom will be *Women Talking* by Miriam Toews. This novel is based on real events that occurred in a remote Mennonite colony in Bolivia between 2005 and 2009. Women were being drugged and abused during their sleep and it had been learned that it was by men in their village. All of the men have left the village for a few days, and the women, who are all illiterate, have never left the colony and do not speak the local language, must choose either to stay in the only world they have ever known or dare to escape into an unknown. The men will be returning soon. This book is also available as a motion picture. Bring a sandwich and a drink or join us on Zoom whether you have read the book or not. All are welcome.

U-Pick Gathering Songs Coming in July

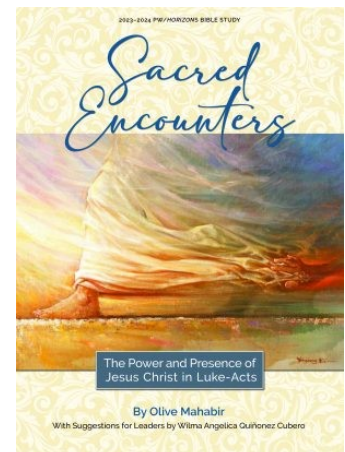
