Making a Difference

Harvey Browne Memorial Presbyterian Church Newsletter **August 2023**

How many of us, on turning the calendar page to August, find ourselves shocked to see that August 9th marks the first day of school. *August 9th*?! we think. *Summer is over already*? And so we shift our lives into a new gear, buying school supplies and filling out forms and generally filling our already over-extended lives with further feelings of frenzy.

Which, this month, has called to mind for me a quote from Thomas Merton. He writes:

There is a pervasive form of contemporary violence...and that is overwork. The rush and pressure of modern life are a form, perhaps the most common form, of its innate violence. To allow oneself to be carried away by a multitude of conflicting concerns, to surrender to too many means, to commit oneself to too many projects, to want to help everyone in everything, is to succumb to violence. The frenzy of our activism neutralizes our work for peace. It destroys our own inner capacity for peace. It destroys the fruitfulness of our own work, because it kills the root of inner wisdom which makes work fruitful. (Conjectures of a Guilty Bystander)

Merton, of course, was writing about the work of an activist who, in their desire to effect change, succumbs to constant turmoil, leaving the well they need to draw from dry due to overuse. Put simply, overcommitment stretches a person thin. Merton encourages mindful attention to rest in order to nurture and enrich the work done in one's life.

It is a message fundamental to who we are as people of faith. *Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy*, we are told. In <u>Sabbath as Resistance: Saying No to the Culture of Now</u>, Walter Brueggemann writes about just how counter-cultural this notion of Sabbath was in ancient times. Looking at the context of Egypt, where the Israelites' constant slave labor made their lives into commodities of Pharoah, the commandment to rest is revolutionary. He writes, "Sabbath...is an act of trust in the subversive, exodus-causing God. [It] is a practical divestment so that neighborly engagement, rather than production and consumption, defines our lives."

As we turn the calendar page to August and feel that frenzy to "do" and "accomplish" bubbling inside of us, may we remember our call to sabbath – a call that is both revolutionary and necessary to sustaining us in the work before us. May we encourage one another in this counter-cultural work. And in finding that God-given rest, may we find our lives and our work deepened and enriched. *Christine*



Wednesday Night Dinner Helpers Needed

It is exciting to watch how much our participation has grown this year with the return of our Wednesday Night dinner program. This past year we were averaging between 80-100 meals eaten each week. As we prepare for the new "school year" to begin for Wednesday Night dinners and programming, we need some more kitchen volunteers! We have a dedicated core group of volunteers, but need relief when members need to be out of town or have conflicts. The duties are simple, you don't have to possess great cooking skills. We offer on the job training.

Some of the Wednesday Night relief tasks and the time period it takes place include:

3:30-4:00pm

• Setting the tables with plastic tablecloths, flowers in a vase or decoration, and salt and pepper shakers

4:30-6:00pm

• Helping someone with collecting money where people check in at the dinner

4:00-5:15pm

- Preparing the beverage dispensers with water, iced tea, and lemonade (tea needs to be brewed and the lemonade made from a mix) and ice, scooper, and plastic cups set out
- Helping someone prepare the salad bowl (mixed greens, tomatoes, peppers, onions, etc.) and setting up the salad bar toppings (croutons, cheese, various dressings)
- Setting out the items on the "children's table" (ice to hold gallon milk jug, cups, loaf of bread, peanut butter and jelly, any special food item that week for children
- Setting out the trays, paper plates, napkins and eating and serving utensils for dinner
- Helping plate the desserts (cutting brownies, pies, cakes, and placing cookies out for individual servings.

After 6:00pm

• Clean up afterwards in the dining area. Removing any trash and taking down tablecloths and decorations. Helping remove the chairs and tables from the gym floor.

We'd love to request assistance from all of our dinner guests, who are available, to commit to help at least **one** time this fall. It would work like ushering or serving communion, no long term weekly obligation, but helping us continue to provide a fun and enjoyable church meal before the evening programs.

Dinners start up in September and run through December. We usually take weeks off for holidays (Thanksgiving, Christmas, and school breaks.)

It is almost time for Presbyterian Women (PW) to kick-off our fall plans. We encourage you to participate in

Mission Co-workers Jeff and Christi Boyd

Jeff and Christi Boyd are PCUSA Mission co-workers based in the Democratic Republic of Congo serving as Regional Liaison (Jeff) and Regional Facilitator for Women's and Children's Interests (Christi). In Jeff & Christi's Spring newsletter, they highlighted a shift taking place in the Congo. Instead of using institutions to house and care for vulnerable children, the are placing these children with families in the synods of East Kasai.So far, 192 Presbyterian congregations have been "vibrant havens" as foster families for abandoned or unaccompanied children. Child protection committees in Congo raise awareness about Child Rights and watch out for and advocate against any violations. Their goal is to work to reunite children placed in foster care with members of their family. Two years into this new program, 48 children had been placed into foster care and 66% of them had already been reunited with relatives. One of the most positive outcomes is the education the children receive. The reunification with their family enables them to be reintegrated into their community easier than if they had been in the institution.

We most recently mentioned Jeff & Christi in an article in the January HB newsletter. Further articles will appear in future HB newsletters to help everyone get to know them a little better and to help establish an ongoing "congregational connection" with them. You may also access a list of the newsletters published by the Boyds on a regular basis. Their newsletters cover a wide range of topics such as global partnerships, local news, helping vulnerable children, growing the church, and human trafficking.
