This summer several groups have been working to freshen up some of our children and youth spaces. Julie has worked to revamp the nursery classrooms with new paint, new carpet and hard flooring, and fun new wall decals. The rooms are beautiful! I know our children and their caregivers will feel warm and welcome in each of the rooms.

Beth and Larry have worked to freshen up choir spaces for our two children's choirs: the Lyric choir (K-2<sup>nd</sup>) and the Westminster choir (3<sup>rd</sup>-7<sup>th</sup>). Each of these children's choirs will rehearse on Wednesday nights, and they have new room set-ups to facilitate these new age groupings. I am excited for and so grateful to Michelle Gilfert, Sally Craxton, and Beth and Larry Brandenburg for teaching our children how to sing and explore faith through music.

Renata DeWees, our new Director of Youth Ministries, has been working tirelessly to prepare the youth spaces for the new programming year. Renata brings energy and imagination to her role, and I'm excited for all that is in store for our youth this year.

And of course, on a daily basis I am excited about food, so that brings me to our famous and beloved Wednesday night dinner. This year our dinners will be catered by Kingsley Meats and Catering. They will provide an entrée, two sides, and a vegetarian entrée for each meal, plus we'll have salad, desserts, drinks, and the kids' table (pb&j, milk). The Congregational Life Committee has been working to reimagine the set up and serving. While the suggested donation for the meal is rising to \$8/adult, \$5/child (with a \$25 family cap), I'm so excited for Wednesday night dinner to start up again and enjoy dinner (that I didn't have to cook!) once a week with the HB community.

Fall programming officially kicks off on Sunday, September 10<sup>th</sup> with breakfast at 9:00 in Eline Hall. Everyone is invited to have breakfast together at 9:00 with a short program about Sunday school classes before we are dismissed to our various classes. Sunday school classes for all ages will resume on September 10<sup>th</sup>, and Wednesday night programming for all ages resumes on September 13<sup>th</sup>. I am grateful to all of our Sunday school teachers and Wednesday night leaders who take part in the faith formation this community.

I am excited for all the various ways we connect with one another at HB – there are too many to count!

With so many energetic and life giving things happening in the life of this community, how could I not overuse the word “excited” in the last couple of weeks? I am full of gratitude and excitement for the coming programming year, and I hope you are too.

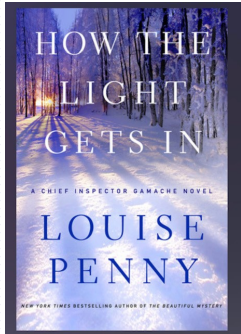


# Harvey Browne Book Clubs

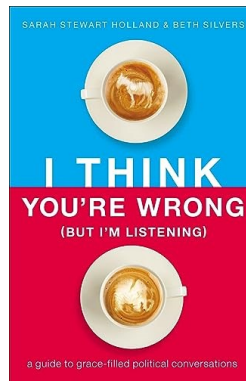
## Bookanalia

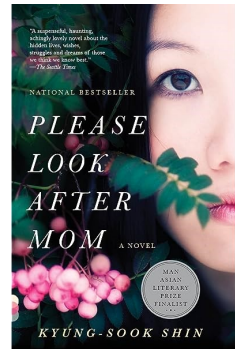
## Pastor's Book Club

## Worship and Music Announcements

### Communion Changes

At the August Session meeting, the Worship and Music Committee made the following recommendation:

***The elements served during the Sacrament of Communion will be grape juice and gluten free bread.***

The Worship and Music Committee discussed the following topics regarding the practice of serving both wine and grape juice:

1. No theological basis could be determined for including wine as an option.
2. Does serving alcohol create a negative situation for someone in recovery? Possibly, and that is enough to question the practice. We serve gluten free bread to accommodate those with allergies, the committee suggested we should eliminate wine, as an option, to accommodate those who may be in recovery or have an addictive disease.
3. Not many PCUSA churches follow the practice of serving wine.
4. There have been instances where a set of trays ran out of juice for the children and those who choose the juice option. It is difficult to configure the right ratio of juice to wine in the trays.
5. The committee felt that the process of receiving the elements was sometimes hindered by the decision of choosing the right cup while being served.
6. It is important to the committee that all the congregation be served the same bread and the same juice.

The Session received the recommendation and it was passed by a unanimous vote.

### Communion Volunteers

Communion Servers have the privileged responsibility of serving the elements during the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Are you an active server? Has it been a while since you served communion? Never served, but would love to be added to the active server's list? Anyone who is an active member of the church is eligible to serve communion at HB.

The Worship and Music Committee will hold a short Communion Server training after worship on Sunday, September 17. We will gather at the communion table immediately after the Closing Voluntary.

## Cabbage Patch Christmas Baskets 2023

### **Cabbage Patch Christmas Baskets 2023: Offering joy and hope to local families who are struggling**

Our Harvey Browne Church family will soon start preparations for the Christmas Baskets mission project for families served by Louisville's Cabbage Patch Settlement House. The Cabbage Patch, located on South Sixth Street, offers programs and services to low-income families, primarily school-age children and youth between the ages of 8 and 16, many of whom live within a two-mile radius of the agency.

In 2022, Harvey Browne provided Christmas baskets containing clothing, gifts, and groceries to 12 Cabbage Patch families. This year we hope to provide baskets to more families. Cabbage Patch families are dealing with higher housing expenses, making life very difficult even for those whose members have taken on a second job. We also hope that this year we can provide food and gifts totaling \$150 per person for each Cabbage Patch family's basket.
