I love stories. I think we all do. On Saturday afternoons, I always get excited when I get in my car, turn on the radio, and hear The Moth Radio Hour coming over the airwaves. *True stories, told live* - that is their catch phrase. For five minutes, people stand before live audiences telling, *not reading*, a story. A true story. It could be about something from childhood, something tragic, something joyful, something disturbing. But it has to be *their* story, and it has to be true.

Sometimes, after listening, I marvel at how people can craft their lives through the lens of a story. Rather than life simply being perceived as a series of contiguous events, these people weave in meaning and humor and grace, molding a story from the life before them.

Chuang Tzu tells the Taoist story of The Woodcarver, a poem about a master carver who shaped a bell stand from precious wood. "When it was finished," he writes, "all who saw it were astounded. They said, it must be the work of spirits." But the woodcarver describes how he created his masterpiece. He details how he meditated, fasting and keeping himself from all distraction. He said that, when he went to the forest, "the right tree appeared before my eyes, and the bell stand also appeared in it, clearly, beyond doubt." He said, "all I had to do was begin."

Like crafting a story from the raw material of life.

In the book of Jeremiah, the Lord speaks to the prophet words of hope coming from a place of desolation, saying, "Surely I know the plan I have for you. Plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope."

Like shaping a bell-stand from a tree in a forest; like crafting a story from the endless steps of life; like looking at what seems desperate and seeing a future of hope, we are *each of us* called to see the potential of what lies before us. To look on this world that can feel so random and find room for meaning.

It makes me think of one of my favorite stories in scripture, where Peter is doing the impossible – he is walking out to Jesus on the water. But the waves start to distract him – this beautiful path he is on towards Jesus gets washed away and he begins to sink.

We are invited, like that woodcarver, like those storytellers, like Peter before his feet began to sink – we are invited with God to believe that more is possible. That beauty is possible. And more than that – we're invited to recognize that it is right there before our eyes, in the raw material we call life.

Friends, we are the storytellers and artisans; the prophets of hope and the disciples on the waves. May we take heart in the beauty all around us and share that Good News in all we say and do.

Letter from Anne Hughes, Clerk of Session

September 25, 2023

Grace and peace to you.

We want to update you regarding the difficult decision to cancel worship on Sunday, Sept. 24 and to share a bit more about the situation that led to this decision and our plans moving forward.

The situation involved the presence of an individual on the church grounds that week and harassment of two staff members that escalated as the week progressed. While the individual was especially angry with Christine and with the Session, he has not made any specific threat to the church or the preschool.

The St. Matthews Police Department was made aware of what was happening immediately and has been both onsite and available for guidance to the church and the preschool. Further, the police are taking action to help ensure that this individual receives the care they need. At no time did the police suggest that activities at the church or preschool be cancelled. The decision to cancel activities that weekend, including worship on Sunday, was made because we were unable to line up security in time.

Since making that decision, the Session and staff have been in contact with a company that will provide security for Wednesday night dinners and worship for the foreseeable future. The building doors will remain locked for activities, meetings, and programming. Leaders will coordinate with group members for building access. Also, the Session will begin working to develop a Disaster Preparedness Team to address crisis situations in the future. If you would be interested in being part of that team, please let me know.

We have taken these steps out of an abundance of caution given the world in which we live and tragedies that have occurred, including in our own community. We are grateful for the outpouring of support that has been received and for our remarkable staff, which has been part of the decision-making process and a great source of strength. They are a blessing to us all.

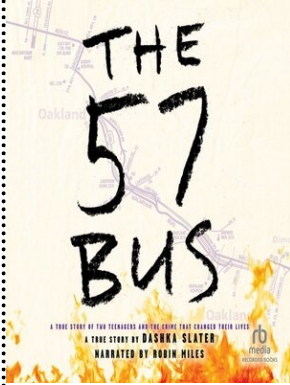

Bookanalia

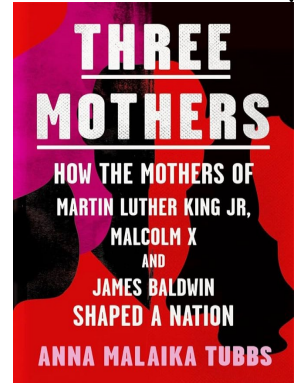
