Thanksgiving— Giving Thanks

November is the month of the big holiday we call Thanksgiving. Many people over many years, and probably in many church newsletters, have reflected on this theme. We remember family and friends, and the history of loving connections we have shared throughout our lives.

For the family of faith named Harvey Browne Presbyterian Church, and for many houses of faith, this time of year is also an important time of giving. It's a time where we focus on those things we want to support with our time, our energy, and our financial resources. Often it is called stewardship season.

For Kristy and me, as your Co-Parish Associates for Pastoral Care, we are aware of the many ways in which this community within Christ's large community support, care for, and love each other day after day. We are grateful for the long history of authentic care which HBPC represents in this neighborhood, and in the wider world.

When you think of HBPC, reflect for a moment on specific times, events, or in a general way, things for which you are grateful, and in which you have been given something valuable in your life: people surrounding you in a time of crisis, appreciation for worship and the music that touches our souls, children and older adults laughing and joining together at a church gathering.

Then think again about that word: Thanksgiving. It means a time of giving thanks. When we look at it for another moment, in another way, it can also mean Thanksgiving: that is, giving out of our thanks, out of our gratitude.

Often in worship, we will hear a leader say something like "out of our abundance, we may now give our gifts", and then collect an offering of money. What's often happening at the same time is the choir or organ or orchestra are sharing, giving, their talents and hearts to help us all focus our worship of God, and reflect on whatever is most pressing on our minds.

I invite you to continue doing that each week, and to broaden your reflection to include quiet questions such as "how can my thanks bring me to giving this week?" Or "how can I give and help more out of my gratitude for God's love for me?"

Consider this: when we are asked to give each week, and each year during stewardship season, perhaps if we focus on our gratitude and giving of our whole lives to express that gratitude, we will be more active givers. We can continue expanding our imagination, and create new ways of expressing our lives of gratitude through actions of love for others, actions of peace and joy in our world, and yes, even in how we use our financial resources.

This day, this month, and this season, may you know deep gratitude, and the joy of continuing that gratitude through the giving of yourself to your place in the world, wherever you find yourself growing.

Peace and joy be with you.



Advent is a season before Christmas where we prepare for the coming of Jesus, and we are kicking off the season of Advent with a party!

Stay after worship on **December 3rd**, the first Sunday of Advent, for lunch, Advent activities, and decorating the church for the Advent season with Hanging of the Greens. Plus, Advent Buddies will be paired with their buddy and complete an activity together. It will be a joyful time to be together and prepare our community of faith for this important season. Advent Buddies

Advent Buddies are an opportunity for adults and children (up through 5th grade) to better get to know one another at Harvey Browne. Each child is paired with an adult who will journey with them throughout the Advent season in the weeks leading up to Christmas. This year will have a little different flow, so read on!

Advent Buddies will be announced at the Advent Kickoff Party on December 3rd after worship. Buddies will be paired and complete an Advent activity together. On Sundays December 10 and 17th adult buddies will be responsible for leaving a note, card, or prayer in their child buddy's mailbox which will accompany a small trinket provided by the Christian Education Committee. On the final Sunday, December 24th adult buddies may leave a small gift (\$15 or less) in their child buddy's mailbox. Mailboxes are located on the ramp from the foyer to the living room and will be marked with each child's name.

Advent Buddies FAQ

Q: Do I have to be present each Sunday in Advent in order to be a buddy? A: No. The only Sunday that is imperative that adult and child buddies attend is Sunday, December 3rd, so that they can connect in person at the Advent Kickoff Party. On other Sundays, adult buddies may leave their note in the mailbox at any time or give to a friend or HB staff to put in the mailbox.

Q: In years past, adult buddies have been responsible for coming up with something to give their buddy each Sunday of Advent. Is that the same for this year? A: This year, adult Advent Buddies will only be responsible for providing a small gift (less than \$15) to their buddy on the final Sunday, December 24th. On December 10th and 17th adult buddies are encouraged to leave a note or card or prayer in their buddy's mailbox which will accompany a small trinket provided by the Christian Education Committee. On December 3rd buddies will spend time together completing an Advent activity at the Advent Kickoff Party after worship.

Q: Are children encouraged to give their Adult Buddy notes or cards? Yes, child buddies are encouraged to give their adult buddy a note or drawing on December 10, 17, and/or 24th. The hope is that the buddy relationships are a two way street.

Q: If I wanted to give my buddy a gift each Sunday of Advent, could I still do that? A: This year the Christian Education Committee is asking that buddies stick with cards and notes for December 10 and 17 and just one small gift (less than \$15) on December 24th. The goal of Advent buddies is relationships and connection, and we strive for the experience to be somewhat equitable for each child.

Cabbage Patch Christmas Baskets 2023 - Weaving Us Together to Assist Families in Need

Everyone in the Harvey Browne Church community is invited to participate in our Cabbage Patch Christmas Basket mission project. On **Sunday, December 17**, our volunteers will deliver baskets of gifts (totaling \$150 per person) to struggling families served by Louisville's Cabbage Patch Settlement House.

There are multiple, important ways we can help between now and December 17:

Donations of financial gifts and goods:

If you missed the opportunity to participate in the special offering collected for the Cabbage Patch mission project last month, you can still give. A special offering for Cabbage Patch will be made during worship on **Sunday, November 19**.

If you would like to purchase a personal gift for a child served by Cabbage Patch, gift tags with children's requests will be displayed on the Gift Tree beginning **Sunday**, **November 12**. You'll need to purchase and wrap your gift and bring it to the Church on or before **Sunday**, **December 10**.

From **November 5** through **December 10**, you can bring items to the Church's Grocery Cart that will be provided to Cabbage Patch families.

Requested items, which cannot be purchased with food stamps, are:

*Bar soap (Dove or generic Dove soap is most often requested)

*Cleaning supplies (bathroom cleaners, bleach, sponges, etc.)

*Deoderant (women's in particular and men's)

*Laundry detergent (most requested is free and clear type)

*Feminine hygiene products (pads and tampons)

*Toilet paper

*Toothpaste, toothbrushes

Volunteering:

On Saturday, November 11, <u>ten Harvey Browne volunteers</u> are needed to shop with a member of each of the Cabbage Patch families who will receive a mission Christmas basket. These HB volunteers are to arrive by 8:15 am at the Jeffersontown Meijer store located at 4500 Hurstbourne Lane. At that time the volunteers will receive information about the family they will help shop for and the dollar amount allocated for each family member. Beginning November 15 until December 13, volunteers are needed to wrap gifts for the Christmas baskets. Gift wrapping will be done after Wednesday night dinners in room 209. For Questions, contact Stacy Esterle.

Gifts and items for the Christmas baskets will be sorted and put together on **Friday, December 15**. This task will be accomplished with the help of Brian and Molly Pollock, the Friends class, and Mariners. More information about this will be provided in upcoming reminders.
