# Making a Difference

Harvey Browne Memorial Presbyterian Church Newsletter

We shall not cease from exploration. And the end of all our exploring. Will be to arrive where we started. And know the place for the first time. T.S. Eliot

It is hard to separate the life of Jesus from movement. From his baptism in the River Jordan, Jesus was constantly on the move, traveling from his hometown of Nazareth to Capernaum by the Sea of Galilee. From there, he was constantly visiting neighboring villages, where he encountered a diverse array of people whom he taught and healed along the way. While John's gospel makes mention of Jesus going to Jerusalem on several occasions, the Synoptics (Mark, Matthew, Luke) set his journey to Jerusalem as a downhill journey after the Transfiguration. From that point, his movement toward Jerusalem represents a journey toward his betrayal and crucifixion, and his ultimate glory.

Jesus' ministry of movement is instructive for those who seek to follow him. Even that term - *following him* - connotes a sense of journey, implying that discipleship if far more than a static exercise. Rather, it involves a sense of vulnerability that allows oneself to be moved - physically and spiritually.

This Lenten season, we are diving into that sense of journey. Each week of Lent, we will explore a different lesson gleaned from Jesus's ministry of movement – lessons like companionship, prayer, de-centering of self, and unattachment. We will offer several practices for "journey" as devotional opportunities, including taking a neighborhood pilgrimage, reading books together, and hearing from Ben Blake about his 500 mile walk on the Camino de Santiago. Further, we will provide space for people to use our new walking labyrinth as a meditative practice. Check the highlights each week for times and locations.

One piece of the Jesus journey that I find captivating is how, at the resurrection, the angels tell the women to return to Galilee, where they will find the risen Christ. Many read this instruction as encouragement to relaunch Jesus' ministry, walking his path now through a lens of resurrection. This reminds us that journey is not about finding a destination, but about working on continual renewal and enrichment; a lifelong endeavor of discipleship informed by the life and ministry of Jesus of Nazareth.

May these weeks of Lent lead to a joyous Easter for you and yours!






