# Making a Difference

Harvey Browne Memorial Presbyterian Church Newsletter **May 2024** 

May is a celebratory month with the Kentucky Derby, Mother's Day, graduation season, and Memorial Day marking the unofficial start of summer. Even the weather can seem like it's piling on to the celebrations with days of "abundant sunshine" (my favorite descriptor in the Weather Channel weather app), blooming flowers, and perfect temperatures.

I was reminded recently that it is important to celebrate – big things and small. Often it seems we are better at dismissing accomplishments or small victories than embracing them. We might say, "Well, that really wasn't a big deal in the grand scheme of things."



When my son was born, those first few weeks were such a blessing but at the same time were some of the hardest of my life. Being a new parent is one of the steepest learning curves I have ever climbed. After some time I remember finding myself accomplishing the smallest possible task, one per day, and feeling such a sense of accomplishment. My first reaction was to say, "Katherine, that is not a big deal. You wrote a thank you note and put it in the mailbox. What's so great about that?"

And yet, at that point in my life, a thank you note in the mailbox was a huge accomplishment. Eventually, I quieted that critical voice and allowed myself to celebrate the small victories day after day.

The poet Mary Oliver reminds us that joy isn't meant to be a crumb. How often do we allow joy to be a crumb in our lives? On the other hand, how often do we wholeheartedly embrace joy, welcome it in, revel in it when we sense its presence? Easier said than done.

With world events and personal challenges it can be difficult to allow ourselves a celebration when there is so much anxiety and suffering swirling in our cultural and personal consciousness. And yet, celebration and joy can act as a buoy that gets us from one hard moment to the next. If we never allow ourselves a bit of celebration or joy, where does our hope come from? In the season of Easter, our Christian faith does just this: declare with joy and amazement God's saving power and triumph over death. It can be an act of resistance to proclaim and celebrate this in our world, and it can be an act of hope to fully embrace that message.

Even if you can only find the smallest moments of joy and celebration in this season, I hope you do find them. Even in the midst of our hardest days, our darkest moments, God's light and Easter hope still surround us. May you celebrate and embrace joy in those moments where you sense that spark igniting within you. Afterall, joy isn't meant to be a crumb.




### **Booktalk**

# The Endowment's 2024 Pledge

In April, the Trustees of the Harvey Browne Foundation approved the distribution of its 2024 contribution. This year, \$110,234.61 will be distributed from twelve individual funds to missions of our church: General Operations and Property, Music and Worship, Christian Education, Deacons, Pastor's Benevolence, and Outreach and Mission. As requested by Session, this amount is 5% of the available assets in the endowment as of June 30, 2023, and represents 9% of Harvey Browne's 2024 budget. The distribution is calculated based on the balance at the end of the prior June so that the Session can include it when preparing the budget for the following year.

Since 2020, the endowment has contributed more than \$500,000 to our church from these annual distributions and has consistently covered 9% of our annual needs. The monies held by the Harvey Browne Foundation come from past and present members who wanted to make a gift to the future of our church. These donations have taken many forms: bequests, 401K/IRA, stock, life insurance proceeds, real property, cash, and matching gifts from an employer. Each donor can designate the gift to support a particular mission. Through the Harvey Browne Foundation, the missions that you support can continue for years to come. Because of these prior gifts, Harvey Browne can have a broader mission than the church and its members alone could support.

In addition to overseeing the endowment, the Trustees seek to share information with the congregation about the workings of the funds and encourage future contributions to grow our continued mission. Please contact a Trustee if you have questions (and it might just provide us with the topic for next month . . . or quarter).

### PW Birthday Offering - May 14

The Birthday Offering of Presbyterian women began in 1922 when the first Secretary of Women's Work of the PCUS, encouraged women to offer "a penny for every year you have lived, and if that is a secret, bring a dollar". Over the last century, grants from these annual donations have funded more that 200 major projects that continue to provide medical care, education, shelter, food and support for people most in need at home and abroad. Harvey Browne continues this tradition with a Birthday Offering Program and Lunch on May 14. The program will start at 10:30 AM. Lunch will be served at noon.



Dianne White, our guest speaker from Shawnee Presbyterian Church, will share the story of Café Ginkgo, a recent recipient of a generous Birthday Offering Grant. Shawnee Presbyterian is located in an economically disadvantaged area of Louisville, where finding adequate nutrition is a challenge. In August 2019, the small congregation began serving free dine-in meals to the community. The café doors closed due to the pandemic. But now, with the *much-prayed-for funding*, the café will reopen with a more efficient, renovated kitchen. The funding also allows for improvements to the fellowship hall where the church will offer enriching activities: tutoring for elementary ages, Gingko Play Zone, financial literacy classes and Mama-to-Mama parenting workshops.
