Our faith makes a great deal about light. "Let your light shine", we are taught at an

early age, implying, inherently, that we must keep our "darkness" at bay. In John 1, we are taught that, in Jesus, "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." Our tendency to pit light and darkness against each another is not unique to Christianity. Darkness, in many religions, is associated with fear and uncertainty. Light, in contrast, is commended as revelatory and uplifting. As a result, our world has spent a great deal of time cele-



brating the light and an equally impactful amount of time warding off "darkness".

All of this has come to my mind given the cosmic event in store for us on next Monday's solar eclipse. Before astronomical understanding could "shed light" on why the sky was suddenly going dark, many cultures viewed a solar eclipse as a sign of impending doom. In ancient China, it was commonly thought that a celestial dragon had attacked and devoured the Sun. In Mesopotamia, eclipses were regarded as omens of bad things to come. In the Aymara tradition, eclipses meant that the sun was sick or near death.

But other traditions have viewed eclipses as opportunities. In Islam, eclipses encourage a chance to offer praise to the one who created both the sun and the moon. In Judaism, eclipses are viewed as a particularly good time for introspection and prayer. And despite Christianity's seeming proclivity to discount the darkness, the eclipse offers us a chance to remember that all of our experience – even those binaries so often unjustly pitted against one another – it all belongs to God.

The impact of setting light against darkness has been profound. It has contributed to justification for racism, colonialism and "manifest destiny". Our preference for "light" over "darkness" has created a false dichotomy between happiness and sadness, celebration and grief, thriving and suffering, as if God is present in one and not in the other.

This could not be further from how we, as Presbyterians, understand our God. "In life and in death, we belong to God", we affirm each week. In all of who we are and all of what we experience, God is present. So this Monday, let us remember that. When we hear the crickets suddenly chirping as the sky goes dark. When the air gets cooler and the birds start to sing, again, their morning song. Let us give thanks to God for being right there with us, through it all.




### **Harvey Browne Book Clubs**
