Making a Difference

Harvey Browne Memorial Presbyterian Church Newsletter

It goes without saying that we live in divisive times, and this reality is only amplified now as we enter the last month before the presidential election. What used to feel like different philosophies or good-hearted rivalries now feels different: us vs. them, in vs out, you vs me. I doubt any of us have escaped the implications of this shift, whether through tensions around the dinner table or how friends now relate to one another. It is real and it is hard. And I think we can all agree – it is not as it should be.

Many groups try to overcome this divide by rallying around some common purpose. Priya Parker, in her book, *The Art of Gathering*, writes about how important it is to have a defined purpose when groups gather. For some groups, the purpose might revolve around a leisure activity like bridge, pickleball, or books. For others, the purpose might be educational, like learning to bake, speak French or work on old cars. While we might have several groups like this at church, it is important to remember that, fundamentally, as a church, our purpose for gathering is "to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ" (Ephesians 4).

At church, our purpose is Christ. And in times of division, it is helpful to remember that what connects us isn't any activity or program. It is Christ.

Over the course of these next couple of months, we are going to take some time to step back from the rhetoric around us and explore what it means to be connected in Christ. What does it mean to be connected in Christ with people with whom we vehemently disagree? What does it mean to be connected in Christ with people who have lost the ability to talk to one another, or who perhaps believe they have nothing in common?

Scripture will guide us and so, too, will our Book of Confessions, which is a collection of documents written from some of history's most divisive moments, spanning the times of the early church to the modern era. What can we learn from the breadth of this Christian movement that can guide us now? How can we rise above and remember what binds us, so that we can then focus in and live our lives more meaningfully and with more purpose?

Being connected in Christ isn't easy, friends. It is way more convenient to cut people out, picking and choosing those who align with what we think and like. But like it or not, acknowledge it or not, we are connected in Christ.

So together, let us equip ourselves for the work of ministry, so that we can build up the body of Christ in our church, in our families, in our communities, and in our world.

All but one survey indicated that most people check the menu each week in the monthly newsletter, Highlights, or Good News to Go.





Christmas Cabbage Patch Families

Christmas for Cabbage Patch Families

For more than 30 years, Harvey Browne Presbyterian has partnered with The Cabbage Patch Settlement House to provide clothing, gifts, and groceries at Christmas to families who are struggling to pay their bills.

Although it's only October, we are already working on this beloved Christmas mission project. Cabbage Patch, located on South Sixth Street, offers programs and services to low-income families, primarily schoolage children and youth between the ages of 8 and 16. Many of these families live within a two-mile radius of the agency. The mission of the non-profit agency, established in 1910, is "to provide life-changing academic, recreational, and mentoring opportunities through Christ-centered values."

During the worship service on **October 27**, the special offering will be accepted for this mission project, allowing HBPres to provide clothing, necessities, groceries, and gifts which members of our congregation will deliver to Cabbage Patch families' homes on **December 15**.
