- **Wednesday, April 16-** There will be no Wednesday Night Dinner or programming on April 16 (Chancel Choir will still rehearse at 6:00 PM in the Sanctuary.)
- **Maundy Thursday, April 17-** Join us for our Maundy Thursday Dinner and Worship service. Worship will take place around tables, and we will share a simple meal together at 6:00pm in Eline Hall. Dinner will be vegetable soup and bread. Communion elements will be gluten free bread and grape juice.
- **Good Friday, April 18-** Join us at 7:30 PM in the Sanctuary for the Tenebrae Service. The Good Friday Tenebrae service is a Harvey Browne tradition, offering a powerful combination of readings and choral pieces which tell of the final hours of Jesus' life. The service includes a dimming of the sanctuary lights and a thunderous organ depiction of an earthquake. Many regard this as one of the most powerful worship services of the year.
