Ways to Help La Escuelita Learning Hub- La Escuelita Learning Hub (417 W Ashland Ave., off Southern Parkway), sponsored by Beechmont Presbyterian Church, serves 8-20 immigrant children (grades K-12) every afternoon after school to improve their reading and English. They use an online reading program but are trying to work 1-to-1 with these students using only ONE computer. That limits the time for lessons to 15 minutes per child. They would appreciate donations of good, used computers. The only real requirement is that the laptop or desktop be able to connect to the internet. If you don't know how to erase your personal files, we can have that done for you (just tape a note to the device to let us know). They also need volunteers to work with immigrant children on reading. It involves sitting with a child to help him or her pronounce and understand short passages that are on a computer screen, then to make a quick note in the logbook as to which lesson was completed.
