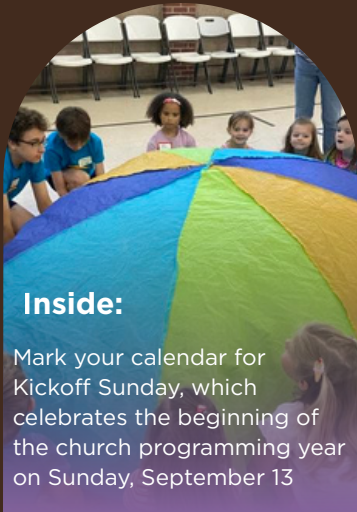

A unique aspect of Ferncliff is our 10,000-sq ft Disaster Assistance Center, better known as “the DAC.” DAC is operated by Ferncliff and enjoys a close cooperative relationship with [Church World Service \(CWS\)](#) and [Presbyterian Disaster Assistance \(PDA\)](#). The DAC is a designated site for receiving, inspecting, building, storing, and shipping CWS Gift-of-the-Heart kits to aid in immediate/long-term disaster recovery and ongoing efforts including homelessness and immigration.

Shining a Light on Service

Dave Doehnert has been representing Harvey Browne for nearly 13 years whenever Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has been called to help. He joined PDA in August of 2013 and retired this past April, with multiple deployments. He traveled to various locations including Key West, Hawaii, California (2-3 times), Houston (multiple times), Kentucky (both east for floods and west for tornadoes), Ft. Myers, Charleston (SC), New Jersey, upstate NY, Illinois, and Western North Carolina.



Dave, a lifelong Presbyterian and retired physician assistant (still practicing as a volunteer one day a week at Mercy Medical Clinic in Shelbyville), served on PDA's national response team to provide disaster response guidance. Teams are deployed once the disaster area is deemed safe, meeting with the local Presbyter to learn where they can be of help, often meeting with survivors in local churches and community centers. "They call it a Ministry of Presence, to be there and listen, without offering unsolicited religious framing," he explained. Proselytizing is prohibited per National VOAD guidelines. Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster is a coalition of independent non-profit, faith-based, and community organizations. Founded nationally in 1970 after Hurricane Camille, VOAD coordinates groups like the Red Cross to prevent duplicated effort and to streamline aid. He also scouted potential volunteer host sites, identifying churches able to house future volunteer teams. Then a separate "hosting team" conducted detailed compliance checks (fire codes, insurance, safety, etc.). A final element of every deployment was daily written reports, submitted to PDA.



Dave's first disaster experience was a post-Katrina trip in 2005, organized through Harvey Browne by Skip Light. He formally joined PDA after retirement, attending a discernment weekend where candidates are assessed for mental stability and suitability before being accepted to the team. Continuous training followed on Psychological First Aid, the availability of PDA grants, emotional/spiritual care, and annual full-team gatherings for team building.

During his tenure, the national volunteer team size has ranged between 80-110 members but a typical deployment team consists of 3-4 people who are sent out at the local Presbytery's invitation for 5-7 days.

For part of his time, he was embedded in the Red Cross as a chaplain; those deployments lasted 2-3 weeks, focusing on shelter-based spiritual care and FEMA recovery center outreach.

Among his most difficult deployments was the Black Mountain area after Hurricane Helene in Western North Carolina, in part because they were sent in atypically early, when the devastation was fresh. They had no running water at



their lodging, 12-hour field days, and one shower in a week. They even carted garbage cans of water from the swimming pool to flush toilets. Dave spent about 17 days there and still remembers the shocked looks on the faces of residents who lost so much.

Helping in the aftermath of the Western Kentucky Tornadoes in 2021, Dave said, was perhaps his most rewarding experience. He was deployed with fellow Kentuckian, the Rev. Donna Melloan, a Presbyterian minister who serves as a chaplain at UofL Hospital, due to their proximity to the site. He particularly remembers

the destruction of the 100+ year-old Mayfield Presbyterian Church, which was flattened by the tornado. During this deployment, he engaged in unusually deep follow-up, attending presbytery meetings, giving presentations, and participating in ongoing recovery over many weeks.

Recently Dave received a certificate of appreciation from PDA, a card signed by many of his peers, and a ceramic cross made by Louisville Stoneware featuring the PDA slogan—"Out of Chaos, HOPE." The graphic at the base of the cross is the PDA logo which represents a hurricane being contained.

Harvey Browne adds its appreciation to Dave for his many years of service, which he modestly says was fueled by our support. Thank you, Dave!



SESSION MINUTES

The Session of Harvey Browne Presbyterian Church did not meet for a regular Stated Meeting in August.

However, the following business was handled in July and August:

- The Manse Task Group brought to Session a recommendation to approve the sale of the former manse property, aka Willey Dental Offices, to an aesthetics clinic for \$490,000.00. Session approved this action by email vote in July.
- Session called a Congregation meeting for July 26. The following business was handled:
 - 1) Elected Jenny Garcia to the office of Ruling Elder for the Class of 2028.
 - 2) Approved the recommendation from Session to sell the property at 4213 North Church Way for \$490,000.00
 - 3) Approved sabbatical for Rev. Christine Coy Fohr during the months of June, July, and August 2027.
- The Session held a retreat at the church on Saturday, August 15. As part of the retreat Session approved a revised Child, Youth, and Vulnerable Adult Protection & Ministry Life Policy. Harvey Browne Church is committed to fostering a community in which children and youth are safe, respected, valued, and able to grow in faith. This policy establishes expectations and procedures that promote the wellbeing of children, youth, and the adults who lead them, guide healthy relationships, and provide clear processes for responding to concerns or incidents. Members of the task group who worked on this revised policy were Alex Bumpas, Veda Pendleton, Brad Zuber, Sarah Zuber, and Rev. Katherine Kupar.
