Building Closed on Fridays- As we wind down the program year, the Session would like to thank the staff for all their hard work to make this such a successful year. As an acknowledgement of this, the Session approved closing the building on Fridays from **Now-August 8**. We hope the staff will take this time to rest and enjoy time with their families.

June Grocery Cart- The Grocery Cart for June is for Hildegard House and House of Ruth. Hildegard House is Kentucky's first and only comfort care home. Through the support of our community and with the help of many volunteers, we provide a home and compassionate care for individuals at the end of life who have no home or loved ones to care for them so that they may die with dignity. The supplies Hildegard House is asking for this year are as follows. Individual sizes of: regular flavor applesauce (Not Cinnamon or Sugar Free), Jello (not sugar free), pudding (not chocolate), fruit cups, instant mashed potatoes, packets of Stevia, wrapped peppermint candies, paper towels, bottled water, AA batteries, baby wipes, gallon Ziploc freezer bags, sandwich and snack bags. The mission of House of Ruth is to provide housing and support services for people living with HIV and their families who are homeless, at risk of losing their homes, or need financial help. The supplies House of Ruth is asking for this year are as follows. (70% of their clients are men, so please consider that for scented products) shampoo, body wash or bar soap (masculine or neutral scent), toilet paper, deodorant, razors, toothbrush (individually packaged), toothpaste, tampons and pads (individually wrapped), dish soap (smaller bottles, 3-8 oz), and laundry pods.
