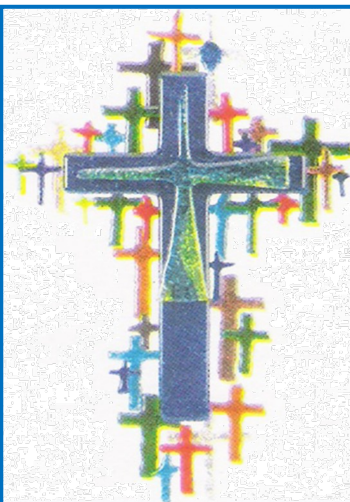

Many years ago, on Good Friday, I took a walk on a spring day. It was one of those afternoons where the sun beckoned through my work window, encouraging me to set aside whatever I was doing and get outdoors. So, not wanting to miss my chance at some sunshine, I pulled on my coat and went outside. Because it was Good Friday, I had one of my favorite hymns, *When I Survey the Wondrous Cross*, running through my head. I've long cherished the contrasting words in its third line — "did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown" — and I was humming them along as I walked (as pastors do). Just as I was hearing those words in my head, the most incredible thing happened. Suddenly, from the sky, with the sun still shining, balls of hail started to fall. They pelted me on the head as I was basking in the sun, and I just remember thinking, "well, this is just perfect."

Sometimes Easter can hit us over the head like that. If we set Easter bunnies and egg hunts aside, we're left to realize that Easter is this balance of contrasts between love and sorrow, pain and triumph, hailstorms and breathtaking sunshine.

Natalie Sleeth, who wrote the beloved hymn, "Hymn of Promise" in 1986, perfectly captured the power of these Easter contrasts. Sleeth, who wrote over 200 anthems – many for children's choirs - possessed a rare ability to explain complex theology through accessible language. She wrote "Hymn of Promise" after being inspired by a line from T.S. Eliot ("In the end is my beginning"), going on to use contrasting images to explain resurrection and the promise of life that can be found, even in death. Just look at the hymn's second stanza:



*There's a song in every silence, seeking word and melody;
There's a dawn in every darkness, bringing hope to you and me.
From the past will come our future; what it holds, a mystery,
Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.*

Easter encourages us to hold the contrasts of our lives with holy wonder, trusting that God can see the promise even when we cannot. The hymn's final line is:

*In our death a resurrection; at the last, a victory,
unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.*

May we hold the paradox of this season with gentleness; and with the hope of this Easter promise ringing in our hearts, may we boldly respond: thanks be to God!

- June 30th - *The Greatest Sentence Ever Written* by Walter Isaacson. The Grocery Cart for April is for Wayside Christian Mission. **The purpose of the Wayside Christian Mission is to respond to the human need of the poor and homeless by (1) providing temporary housing/shelter, food, clothing, nurturing, spiritual and social enrichment, encouragement and referrals (2) and by providing the support services and skills that would permit and encourage a return to a state of self-sufficiency so that human dignity can be restored and the love of God can be shared.** The most needed supplies they are asking for this year are bottled water, snacks (granola bars, peanut butter crackers, etc.), small hand sanitizers, deodorant (men and women), laundry detergent, feminine products, toilet paper, razors, diapers, and baby wipes.
