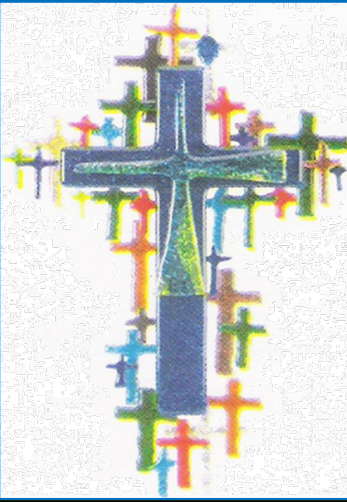

In the April issue of the *Presbyterian Outlook* discusses the power of joy. Rev. Tom Are writes, “Joy is rooted in the confidence that life’s disappointments are not evidence that God has abandoned us (but rather) that the spirit of Christ will work for that deliverance.” He quotes the theologian Karl Barth who wrote that joy is the “defiant nevertheless.” “Joy”, Are writes, “is not the result of turning a blind eye to the brokenness of ourselves and our world; instead, joy is confidence in the power of love.”



Leaning into this “defiant nevertheless” feels particularly necessary right now. Here we are, deep into the season of Lent, moving ever-closing toward Good Friday and yet, nevertheless, defiantly confident in the reality of Easter. I see it all around me this time of year –

landscapes that look bleak and bare of life suddenly, defiantly in bloom – a bud emerging, tender leaves appearing, the defiant nevertheless painted in real time, for all to see.

Such is the way of joy, its surprising emergence alongside challenge and struggle. It is an experience which builds a deep reservoir within us, carrying us through the ebb and flow life inevitably holds; carrying us through times that would lead us to despair and to doubt. Joy pursued, blossoming when least expected, buoys us. It confronts us in our Good Friday mindset and reminds us with the sunrise – *aha!* – God is not done with us.

This Lenten season, as we have looked at “The Hardest Part” of life together, we have named in worship and devotion the hurts we carry. But right next to them, we have made it a practice to name the hope we find – that “defiant nevertheless”. In doing so, we have made a practice of building that reservoir of life-giving nourishment, that sustaining presence of joy.

The Easter story, we know, is not all bunnies and egg hunts. The real story holds heartache and suffering *and* that divine defiant nevertheless: a stone rolled away, a tomb once filled now empty, a story once closed now alive and on the loose. This Easter, may we consider what our “defiant nevertheless” might be so that we can lean on it, learn from it, and draw upon it through the challenges this life holds.

Good Friday Tenebrae Worship Service

The Good Friday Tenebrae service is a Harvey Browne tradition, offering a powerful combination of readings and choral pieces which tell of the final hours of Jesus' life. The service includes a dimming of the sanctuary lights and a thunderous organ depiction of an earthquake. Many regard this as one of the most powerful worship services of the year. Those with sensitivities to sound may want to be aware—a note will be included in the bulletin.

Rev. Dr. Patricia K. Tull

The Rev. Dr. Patricia K. Tull is A.B. Rhodes Professor Emerita of Old Testament at Louisville Presbyterian Seminary, an environmental theologian, and author of *Inhabiting Eden: Christians, the Bible, and the Ecological Crisis* (2013) and *Let Justice Roll Down: God's Call to Care for Neighbors and All Creation* (2024-2025 Horizons Bible Study). A 2016 recipient of the Presbyterians for Earth Care William Gibson Eco-Justice Award for faith-based environmental work, she lives with her spouse, the Rev. Don Summerfield, in the net-zero home they designed near Henryville, Indiana. They enjoy life with their six kids, four in-laws, and eight grandkids.

Wednesday Night Program "Electrifying Our Lives"

A decade ago, environmental responsibility meant recycling and changing lightbulbs. Today we have many more opportunities right in our homes, with our families, to move the needle on the climate crisis. We will discuss the benefits and how-to's of electrification and acquire tools to help make this effort manageable. Taught by Rev. Dr. Patricia K. Tull, all are welcome to attend. HBU "A Closer Look at the Apocryphal Book of Tobit"

The Book of Tobit is a "work of humorous fiction written to entertain but also critique and instruct. It contains farcical elements: blindness by bird excrement, a murderous love-sick demon, a father with the corpses of his sons-in-law buried in the backyard. There's also a magical fish." In this series we will dive in and unpack the book of Tobit, all the while seeking to understand how we might connect more deeply with God and our faith through it.

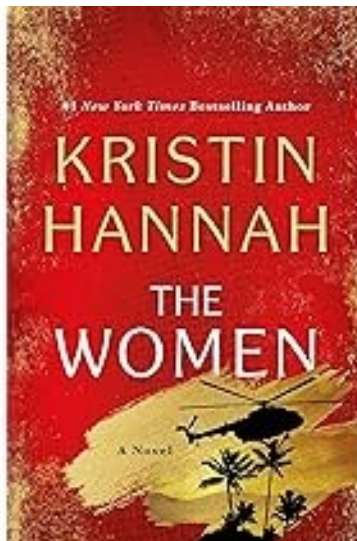

BookTalk

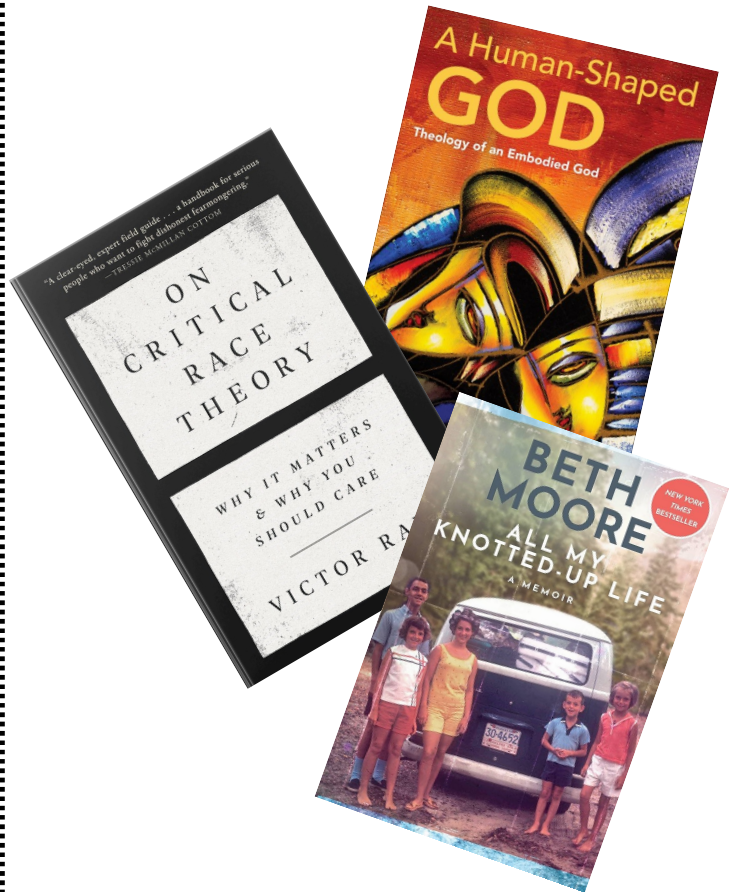

Hand soap and sanitizer
Soap, shampoo, lotion and powder for men, women and babies

Clothing for men, women, children and babies
Under garments for men and women
Socks and shoes for men, women, children and babies
Pillows and blankets



Wayside Christian Mission was founded in 1957 by Rev. Richard Anderson. In the '50s it was difficult to raise money. When a wealthy gentleman offered Rev. Anderson a \$7,400. donation (which is \$83,000. today); the catch was that Wayside could only take in white folks. Rev. Anderson declined the donation saying "...we're taking care of all God's children". Wayside became the first Rescue Mission south of the Mason-Dixon line to be integrated.

Ways to Serve in the Immigrant and Refugee Communities

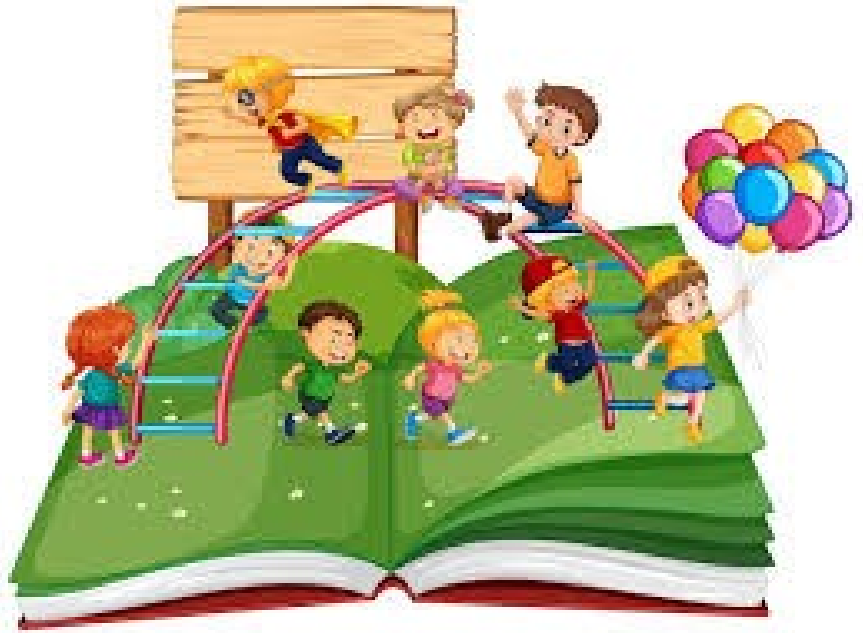
La Escuelita Learning Hub (417 W Ashland Ave., off Southern Parkway), sponsored by Beechmont Presbyterian Church, serves 8-20 immigrant children (grades K-12) every afternoon after school to improve their reading and English. They use an online reading program but are trying to work 1-to-1 with these students using only ONE computer. That limits the time for lessons to 15 minutes per child. They would appreciate donations of good, used computers. The only real requirement is that the laptop or desktop be able to connect to the internet. If you don't know how to erase your personal files, we can have that done for you (just tape a note to the device to let us know). Please place donations in the drop closet (a box will be labeled LA ESCUELITA). Contact Jean Wolph for more information, jcwolph@gmail.com. They also need volunteers to work with immigrant children on reading. It involves sitting with a child to help him or her pronounce and understand short passages that are on a computer screen, then to make a quick note in the logbook as to which lesson was completed. They especially need help on M, T, Th, 4-7 pm (or any part of that time period that you are available). Contact Pastor Debbie Braaksma for more information, debbie.braaksma@outlook.com.

It is a wonderful way to honor her memory!

Last February, when longtime Preschool Board Member and Harvey Browne Presbyterian Church member, Carol Tinkle passed away, Carol's family named the preschool as a recipient of memorial gifts. We tucked that money away until we could best decide how to properly honor Carol. In January, the preschool board voted to create The Carol Tinkle Music Fund. The fund is used to supplement our growing music program by replacing and adding new instruments and bringing in musical experiences for our children. Creating a music fund in Carol's memory helps us remember the many gifts she shared with the preschool, especially as a devoted board member and as our pianist for the Kangaroo Christmas Program.

We are looking forward to celebrating with our families as we welcome them for Easter parties.
